Calls of Interest

Offense: Disorderly Conduct-Exposure

Date: 01.01.12

Time: 0218 hours

Location: 13600 blk Treasure Trail

An officer was conducting routine patrol and had turned onto West Bitters Road from Treasure Trail, heading eastbound. The officer observed a vehicle traveling at what appeared to be a high rate of speed. As the vehicle approached, the radar's audible alarm activated indicating the vehicle was speeding and the radar displayed the speed of the vehicle at 70 mph in a 40 mph zone. The officer turned to follow the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop. The operator of the vehicle pulled over in the 13600 block of Treasure Trail. The officer approached the vehicle and identified himself and informed the driver of the reason for the stop. The officer immediately detected an odor of alcohol emitting from the driver and noted that his eyes were red and glassy. The officer requested his driver's license and asked him to exit the vehicle and submit to a Standardized Field Sobriety Test, to which he complied. The officer did not feel there was sufficient cause to continue with the test, but did not feel comfortable allowing the driver to continue to drive. The officer suggested that the driver contact a responsible driver to assist him in getting home. The driver contacted a friend, who agreed to respond. While the officer was completing the speeding citation, the driver approached stating that he needed to urinate and could not hold it any longer. The driver was told that he would need to wait until his ride arrived. The driver became agitated and approached the officer with the same request. The officer informed him to return to his vehicle and wait until they were finished. He was also told he could not urinate on the roadway in a public place. The driver returned to his vehicle, stating that we would need to give him another ticket because he could not hold it. The driver walked to the front of his vehicle where he proceeded to urinate on the roadway. As the driver walked back to his vehicle, a person exited a residence and told the driver that he did not appreciate him urinating in "our city". The resident began to verbally argue with the driver, inciting the driver to argue with the resident. The driver was further detained and cited for Disorderly Conduct. When the driver's friend arrived, he was released to his friend.

A resident called and wanted to make a report of some disturbing pictures that were sent to her cell phone. The resident reported that at 1954 hours on this date, she received a picture of a penis on her cell phone. She also reported that on Monday 01-02-12 at 2200 hours she received a picture of a male subject and then right after that she received a picture of a penis. The resident does not know who the subject is. The resident stated she found the pictures very alarming and disturbing. The resident was told she would be contacted by an investigator. The resident was also advised to block the subject's phone number so he could not send her anymore pictures. The resident was asked to save the text messages for the investigator.

Location: 13700 blk San Pedro

An officer observed a vehicle traveling in the 16000 block of San Pedro. The officer observed the vehicle fail to signal a lane change. A computer check of the registration showed the vehicle did not have current insurance. A traffic stop was initiated on the vehicle and contact was made with the driver and the passenger. The driver attempted to exit the vehicle and when he did, an opened beer can fell onto the driveway. The officer had the driver sit back in the vehicle and requested his identification. The driver said he did not have a driver's license and that he had warrants. At that time the officer asked both males if there was anything inside the vehicle that they should not have. The passenger told the officer he had a syringe in the glove box. The officer requested cover officer and both males were removed from the vehicle and patted down for officer safety. The males were placed in the back seat of the patrol cars. The officer looked inside the unlocked glove compartment where he located an empty syringe. During the search, the officer observed a blue and white plaid jacket on the seat. Inside the front left pocket the officer located a syringe containing a small amount of liquid. The syringe was field tested and showed a presumptive positive for heroin. The officer asked the driver if the blue and white plaid jacket on the front seat belonged to him, to which he replied, "yes." When the officer asked about the syringe in the pocket, the driver said it was not his. A computer check showed the driver to have seven active San Antonio Municipal Court warrants for his arrest. At that time the driver was informed he was under arrest for Possession of Controlled Substance as well as the warrants. The passenger was cited for drug paraphernalia and released. The driver was booked into jail.
