Offense: Theft \$50-\$500

Date: 01.24.12

Time: 1530 hours

Location: 14800 blk San Pedro

A staff member of a medical office called the city cellular phone and requested an officer respond to the location on behalf of a customer who had items taken from her while at the location. Upon the officer's arrival, contact was made with the female customer who reported she had arrived at the location for a child's appointment. The woman related while she waited in the waiting room, she was reading a book on a Kindle Fire device. The woman said when she was called back for to be seen, she placed the Kindle down on a table and forgot to pick it back up and take it with her. Once she was taken back to the examination room, she returned to the waiting room to retrieve the Kindle but it was gone. The officer spoke with office staff about the item and office staff members related there was only one other couple in the waiting room at the time of the theft. Staff members related the male got up at one point and appeared to be carrying something with him as he exited the business. Staff members related the male never returned to the office. The officer contacted a woman about the missing item. The woman said she did not see the missing item and related there were others in the waiting room besides her and her fiancé. The woman said her fiancé had left the location, but would be returning to pick her up once the appointment was completed. The complainant was given a case number for the theft report and instructions on providing the officer with specific identifying information once she is able to locate it. The officer waited in the parking lot of the location for the male to arrive. Contact was then made with the male in the parking lot of the business. The male denied any knowledge of the missing item and verbally consented for the officer to conduct a search of the vehicle. The search did not reveal the missing item. This case was forwarded to CID.

Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance/Possession of Marijuana

Location: 14300 blk San Pedro

An officer observed a vehicle pass him. As the vehicle passed, the officer observed that the vehicles front windshield was badly cracked to an extent that the drivers view was obstructed. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle and contact was made with the driver. The driver was informed of the reason for the stop and the officer requested his driver's license and insurance. While speaking with the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. The officer asked the driver if there was marijuana in the vehicle and he said yes. The officer had the driver step out of the vehicle and the officer conducted a pat down of the driver and then he was placed in handcuffs. During a search of the vehicle the officer located three separate baggies of a green leafy substance that tested a presumptive positive for marijuana. Also located was a glass smoking pipe. On the front passenger seat, the officer located a clear plastic container. Inside the container was a small baggie containing a crystal looking substance believed to be methamphetamine. After arresting the driver for the marijuana, his vehicle was impounded and he was transported to the police department. While at HCVPD, the officer tested the crystal substance and the substance returned with a presumptive positive for methamphetamine. The male was booked on charges for both drugs. All evidence was submitted to CID.

An officer observed a vehicle fail to stop at the stop sign located at the intersection of Tower Drive and Winding Way. A traffic stop was initiated on the vehicle and contact was made with the driver. The officer requested a driver's license and insurance from the driver. The driver said he did not have his driver's license. A computer check showed that the driver had three active driver's license suspensions. The driver was arrested and the vehicle was released to his wife. The driver was booked for driving on a suspended license.
