Offense: Burglary of a Building

Date: 01.29.12

Time: 1900 hours

Location: 15600 blk San Pedro

An officer was dispatched to a local business for a burglar alarm with glass breakage. Upon arrival the front entry door was found with the lower half of the door glass broken out. The building was cleared and no one was found inside. It appeared that an unknown suspect kicked in the door glass and entered the building. Once inside, the unknown suspect took a flat screen television that was mounted on the wall. The business owner arrived at the location. The owner and the officers walked through the building to determine if anything else had been stolen. The owner said everything else appeared to be in order. Officers photographed the crime scene and gathered evidence which was turned in to CID. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

A citizen called the city cell phone and requested an officer to file a report. The officer arrived at the business and contacted the male complainant. The complainant reported that as he entered the male locker room at the gym, he noticed a gym member acting suspicious by looking around at belongings left unattended. The complainant walked past the suspicious male and placed his gym bag on the bench in front of his locker. The complainant then proceeded to the shower area. After the complainant was finished getting dressed, he noticed his keys were missing and went to the front desk to see if anyone had turned them in. The front desk employees did not have his keys. The complainant went outside to his vehicle and observed his keys on the front driver seat. The male also noticed his work bag and glove compartment were open. The complainant returned inside and contacted an employee. The complainant told the employee that he believed

the suspicious male took his keys and stole his Ipod from his bag. No other items were taken from the complainant's vehicle. The complainant gave a description of the suspicious male to the officer. The complainant did not want fingerprints taken from his vehicle because he did not have time to wait.

Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws

Location: Winding Way @ South Tower Drive

An officer observed a vehicle fail to stop at the stop sign located at Winding Way and South Tower Drive. A traffic stop was initiated on the vehicle and contact was made with the driver. The juvenile driver told the officer that he did not have a driver's license and that the car belonged to his mother. There were three other people in the vehicle which were also juveniles. The officer contacted the driver's mother who said she would be on the way to the officer's location. Parents of the juvenile passengers were also contacted and told to pick up their children. The driver's mother arrived and took custody of her son and her vehicle. The other juveniles were released to their parents. The driver was cited for Disregard Stop Sign and No Drivers License before he was released to his mother.

Offense: Assist other Agency

Time: 1101 hours

Location: 200 blk Sunway

A HCV officer heard a Hollywood Park officer check out with a suspect at a burglar alarm call. The HCV officer proceeded to the location to assist since the HPPD officer was alone at the time. The HCV officer arrived and observed the HPPD officer with his Taser drawn on the suspect. The HCV officer provided cover while the HPPD officer took his suspect into custody. The HPPD officer told the HCV officer that the suspect was attempting to burglarize a house. The HCV officer leaned the suspect against the patrol car due to him continually moving around as the HPPD officer attempted to search him. The officers observed two clear bags fall out of the suspects pants containing a light brown balled up substance and the other bag containing a white powdered substance. They were later found to be drugs. Officers found power tools belonging to the homeowner, in the suspect's vehicle. HPPD arrested the suspect for Burglary and drugs.
