A resident contacted City Hall regarding a vehicle that had driven through his fence on the East side of his property. The car continued west through the pasture behind his residence, through his vegetable garden, did a few doughnut circles in the grass, then drove through a second fence

on the west side of the property before the vehicle came to rest approximately 125 feet into the neighbor's property. The resident stated he did not know who had done this damage, but he had not given consent for anyone to enter onto his property. Officers went to the neighboring property to inspect the vehicle. The vehicle sustained considerable damage from the impact of the fences. An officer also observed holes in all of the windows and windshield from what appeared to be a hammer. A hammer with a wooden handle was observed in the back seat area of the car, resting on top of the back seat. The center console was damaged and the radio was not observed. The key was in the ignition, but the car was not running. An officer also saw a black handle of a knife resting on the hood. Upon closer observation, the knife blade had broken off in the passenger rear tire. Each of the other three tires had been punctured and were flat. All of the contents of the car had been pulled out and thrown around the car. There was also damage to the roof that looked like someone had jumped on the roof and stomped it in. The hammer and knife were secured as evidence. Attempts to contact the vehicle owner were unsuccessful.

An officer was dispatched to a theft report. A customer at a local tire shop reported that at approximately 11:30 AM four Nitto all terrain tires were left outside the south door of the business.
