Offense: Assist the Public

Date: 01.08.13

Time: 1050 hours

Location: 15600 blk San Pedro

An officer observed a stranded motorist on the access road. The officer turned the overhead lights on and diverted traffic due to the inclement weather. The officer remained at location until the driver was able to start her car and depart the location. The officer resumed patrol.

A HCV officer was dispatched to Hollywood Park for a Burglary in Progress call. The HPPD officer was the only patrol officer on duty at the time. Both officers conducted a check of the residence and found it to be secure. The HCV officer resumed patrol.

Offense: Violation of Narcotic Laws

Date: 01.12.13

Time: 0218 hours

Location: 14000 blk San Pedro

An officer was parked in the parking of a local business when he observed the operator of a gray Ford; pull into the parking lot at a very slow speed. As the driver pulled the vehicle further into the parking lot, it appeared the driver caught sight of the patrol car. The driver immediately turn the vehicle around, exited the parking lot of the business center and travel south on San Pedro. The officer believed this action to be suspicious and proceeded to leave the parking lot, also traveling south on San Pedro. The officer was behind the Ford in the 14000 block of San Pedro and observed the driver initiate a lane change without using a turn signal. The officer pulled behind the Ford and initiated the emergency lights on the patrol car. The driver pulled the vehicle into the parking lot of a church. As the driver was initiating the right turn from San Pedro into the parking lot, the officer had a clear view of the passenger side of the vehicle, to include the passenger side window. The officer observed the passenger seated in the front seat, extend her right arm out of the passenger window and drop an item from her hand and onto the ground. The officer requested a cover unit at that time. The officer made contact with the driver and obtained his driver's license and proof of vehicle insurance. The driver provided an International Driver's License from the country of Kuwait and stated he was from Kuwait, in the military and temporarily assigned to Lackland AFB. The officer attempted to explain the reason for the traffic stop, which the driver had difficulty comprehending. The officer also obtained identification from the right front passenger. When asked what the passenger had dropped on the ground, the passenger stated she did not drop anything out of the vehicle. When a female cover officer arrived, the first officer retrieved the item that the passenger had dropped on the ground. The item was a crushed Marlboro light cigarette pack containing two (2) rolled "joint" cigarettes. The "joints" had a very strong odor, identified by the officer through training and experience, to be suspected marijuana. The officer conducted a computer check which came back clear. The officer returned to the vehicle and asked the female passenger to exit the vehicle. The female continued to deny dropping any item out of the window. When asked if she smoked cigarettes, she stated that she did not smoke. The female was detained and placed in the back of the patrol vehicle. The officer asked the driver for consent to search his vehicle, which he granted. The search of the vehicle did not produce anything illegal; however a red cosmetic bag belonging to the female was retrieved. Inside the cosmetic bag was a full pack of Marlboro light cigarettes. This is the same type of cigarette pack that she dropped out the passenger window. The driver stated that he smoked Marlboro "reds". A full pack of Marlboro reds was found in the center console and on the driver's person. Also found was a black, heavy duty stun gun, found on the floorboard of the front passenger seat. The driver stated that the stun gun was not his and he did not know how it got into his vehicle. The female also denied ownership of the stun gun. The female was arrested and taken into custody for the possession of marijuana. A female officer conducted a search of the female arrestee. The driver was given a verbal warning for changing lanes without signaling and released. The marijuana was tested and the female was booked into jail.
