Calls of Interest

Offense: Wanted Person/Failure to Identify/Possession of Identifying Info

Date: 01.10.16

Time: 1600 hours

Location: 14000 blk San Pedro

An officer observed a male subject, carrying a black backpack, walking west, along a ditch towards a washout area that leads to Aspen Lane. This area has been associated with several burglaries in the past. The officer circled the block and returned to the area and discovered a black backpack and black jacket placed under a large concrete slab. The male subject was not in the immediate area. The officer parked and waited to see if the subject came out of the washout area. The officer then observed the male subject walk from a neighboring business and as he saw the patrol vehicle, he began to move in the opposite direction. The officer called the subject over and asked if the items were his, which he confirmed they were. When asked where he had been, the subject stated that he went to the pawn shop to look around and did not want to carry the backpack with him. The subject seemed really nervous and evasive in his responses. The officer observed that he had a white powdery substance around his right nostril. The officer asked him for his identification to which he replied that he did not have one. The subject identified himself verbally. The subject kept placing his hands in his jacket pockets and continued to state that he did not have an ID on him. For the safety of the officer, the officer asked if he could check his jacket pockets for any item that may hurt the officer, to which he consented and stated that he did not have any weapons. When checking his pocket, the officer discovered a pawn ticket. The officer told the subject that he would be unable to pawn an item without a valid ID. The subject then reached to his back pocket and pulled out a thick, black wallet and handed the officer a Texas ID. The officer looked at the ID and could tell that it did

not belong to the subject. When challenged, several times about the ID, he continued to state that it was his. The officer asked if he could see his wallet. He handed the wallet to the officer and while looking through the wallet he found another TX ID and a Visa card that did not belong to him. The officer placed the still unidentified subject in handcuffs and detained him until the officer could verify his identity. The officer continued looking into his wallet and found a TX ID issued to the subject, which resembled the subject, along with a Social Security card. The officer ran the ID number through the computer and received a return for a Wanted Person for a probation violation. The subject now identified was placed in the back seat of the patrol vehicle. The subject finally confirmed his identity and stated that he knew he had a probation violation and that is why he didn't confirm his actual information. When asked why he had the additional ID's, the male stated that he had found the items at an abandoned apartment building. The male was taken into custody for the probation violation. Six EZ Pawn Tickets were seized and turned over to investigations to follow up for suspected stolen property. While conducting an inventory of the backpack, a check book not belonging to the male was taken into evidence. The items were tagged and placed in the Evidence Room for safekeeping. The male was taken to the Magistrate Office and booked for the probation violation, Fraudulent Use/Possession of Identifying Information and Failing to Identify/Fugitive from Justice. This case was forwarded to HCVPD CID for further investigation.

Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws

Location: 200 blk West Bitters Road

An officer was sitting at the red light located at Bitters Road and South Tower Drive when he observed a grey vehicle drive past him displaying an expired registration sticker. The officer turned around when it was safe to do so and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The officer contacted the driver and explained to him the reason for the stop. He showed the officer a more current Texas registration sticker with an expiration date of 07/2015. At that time, the officer requested he provide his license and proof of insurance. The driver was able to provide the officer with a current Texas DL, but was unable to locate his insurance. The officer returned to the patrol vehicle and conducted a computer check on the vehicle and the driver. The registration return confirmed the 07/2015 registration date. The return also showed an "unconfirmed" insurance status with an expiration date of 10/20/2015. The return on the driver's license showed the license status was Not Eligible. The license also showed to have six (6) active suspensions. Due to the fact that the driver lived at the same location as the traffic stop, the officer did not impound his vehicle. He was issued citations for the Registration, Insurance, and DWLI violations.

Location: 16200 blk San Pedro

While traveling south on San Pedro, an officer observed a SAPD officer frisking an individual with a large cast on his arm at the hood of his patrol car. The HCV officer stopped to see if he

was okay. The SAPD officer asked if he could secure his detainee in the HCV patrol vehicle until a second SAPD unit arrived. The SAPD officer stated that due to the subject's broken arm, he didn't want to place him in handcuffs and he needed to search the subject's vehicle. The HCV officer remained at the scene until the second SAPD unit arrived.
