Offense: Assist other Agency

Date: 01.18.15

Time: 1930 hours

Location: 400 blk Yosemite

HCV officers were dispatched to the 400 block of Yosemite to assist HPPD for a possible burglary in progress. HPPD had only one officer available at the time. Officers arrived at the home and did a thorough search for any intruders and none were found. The female callers reported seeing a man in the house. The HCV officers resumed patrol once all was clear.

Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance

Date: 01.24.15

Time: 0237 hours

Location: 15300 blk San Pedro

An officer ran a license plate and the plate did not match the vehicle. The officer requested backup then stopped the vehicle believing it may be stolen. The officer ordered the male driver to place both his hands out of the driver's side window. The driver complied with the officer's orders. Once contact was made, the officer asked the driver if the vehicle belong to him. The driver told the officer that the vehicle did belong to him. The officer then asked if that was his license plate on the vehicle. The driver said it was not. The officer had the driver exit vehicle and performed a pat down frisk for weapons. During the frisk the officer felt what he believed to be a cylinder shaped container within the driver's front left pocket. The officer asked the driver if he was in possession of a narcotic. The driver said he may have debris of Methamphetamine within his pockets. For officer safety, the driver was detained in hand restraints and escorted to the front of the patrol car where a search was conducted. The driver had a small glass tube containing what appeared to be debris of methamphetamine. This was found in his front left pocket. The officer explained to the driver that a vehicle search would be conducted and asked if there were any more narcotics within the vehicle. The driver said he had a box in the rear

containing a narcotic he was trying to manufacture. The driver described the narcotic as the diluted form of Methamphetamine. The driver continued to say that the Methamphetamine has not crystalized and they were being stored in two separate containers. After the driver admitted to manufacturing of narcotics, the officer informed him he was under arrest and conducted a vehicle search. A box containing the contraband was found at the rear of the vehicle. While inspecting the items found, the officer detected a strong odor of chemical emitting from the box. The officer immediately placed the box on the ground and retreated as he noticed the odor began to overwhelm him. Once a clear distance was obtained, the officer called for SAFD to access the hazardous material. A moment later SAFD Engine 14 arrived on scene. During that time the officer received oxygen to filter out any hazardous chemicals he may have come in contact with. A moment later the area was secured and the collection of evidence began. Within the box, two glass jars containing what appeared to be the diluted form of Methamphetamine with the combine weight of 3 pounds. Concealed within the box were several items needed to manufacture Methamphetamine. The liquid found within the glass jars were field tested at the scene. The test kit gave a positive reaction to the presence of Methamphetamine. All the evidence was collected at the scene and transported to the police department. The driver's cash was seized and he was booked into jail.

Offense: Theft

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

A business owner called to report a theft that had taken place at his business. The owner explained to the officer that he had recently been out of town. When he returned to work he began an inventory and discovered a female employee had checked merchandise out of the inventory system and had taken the merchandise from the store without the owner's consent. The owner confronted the employee and according to him, she confessed to taking the merchandise and returned the property to the owner. The owner intends to file charges against the employee.

Offense: Possession of Marijuana

Location: 100 blk Tower Drive

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. While speaking with male driver, the officer could detect the odor of marijuana emitting from the cab area of the truck. The officer asked the driver if there was any reason he would be able to smell marijuana coming from his vehicle and he said, "No." The officer asked the driver if he had ever been arrested before and he said he was arrested last year for possession of marijuana. At that time the officer had the driver exit the vehicle and the officer began a search of the passenger compartment of the truck for marijuana. Located under the fold down center console/arm rest the officer discovered a cellophane baggie containing a green leafy substance consistent with marijuana. The driver was detained, searched, and placed in the back seat of the patrol car. The officer continued the search of the truck but did not locate any other contraband. The driver was issued citations for Speeding, Driver's License

Not in Possession, and Expired Inspection Sticker. The suspected marijuana was seized and the driver was released at the scene. The suspected marijuana would later be tested. If it should show positive as marijuana, a warrant will be issued for the driver's arrest.
