## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Harassment**

**Date: 01.26.16**

**Time: 1703 hours**

**Location: 14600 blk San Pedro**

A business employee contacted the police department and requested an officer go to her business location to take a harassment report and escort her out to her vehicle. Upon arrival, the female stated that a known male had been calling into the office approximately twenty (20) times a day since 12/17/15. On these calls, he specifically requests the female and speaks to her in a demeaning and combative manner. When the office staff tells the male that she is not in the office, the male will make comments like "I know she's there, I see her truck in the parking lot". The female feels these types of comments are meant to alarm her and cause her mental anguish. The female is a Para Legal at the office. The male has made threats that if she won't talk to him, he is going to get her legal license revoked. The male also calls on one line and when placed on hold, he will call in on a second line to tie up the phone lines. The male has also sent Skype videos to the female in attempt to further harass her. The female related that her firm has had issues with the male in the past with a client receiving threats from him. This case is under investigation.

### **Offense: Theft of a Vehicle**

**Date: 01.28.16**

**Time: 1809 hours**

**Location: 14600 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a local business for a motor vehicle theft complaint. Upon arrival, contact was made with the vehicle owner who related he arrived at the office building where he works at approximately noon. The owner related he owns three covered parking spaces at the back of the parking lot behind the building, and parked his vehicle taking up two of the spots. The owner related he then went inside to his office to work and when he left to depart the

location at approximately 1800 hours, he discovered his vehicle to be missing. The owner showed the officer where the vehicle was last seen and there was no visible glass on the ground. The owner described the vehicle as a four door crew cab, Ford F-350, white in color with a custom made front brush bumper, custom made rear bumper, bed tool box and headache rack that were all gold colored Rhino lined. The vehicle was entered into police computers as stolen.

**Offense: Suspicious Vehicle**

**Time: 2025 hours**

**Location: 100 blk Village Circle**

An officer received a cell phone call from a resident who reported the following: He and his daughter were walking their dog and noticed a white Ford passenger van with an unknown license plate, stopping in front of different residences on Village Circle. The resident stated he has observed the white van do this same thing for the past couple of days. The resident told the officer that the white van was last seen heading towards Hidden View. Upon arrival, the officer searched the area, but was unable to locate the white van. Note: The officer observed a white Ford passenger van last week delivering phone books to each residence on Hill Country Lane. It was driven by a female adult with brown hair. A male adult with grey hair was placing the phone books next to each mailbox. The female and male appeared to be in their late 40's. No signs of criminal activity were observed.

**Offense: Wanted Person**

**Date: 01.30.16**

**Time: 1341 hours**

**Location: 15600 blk San Pedro**

A Ford truck was stopped for traveling 57 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the truck in the 16100 block of San Pedro and made contact with the driver and an adult male passenger. Upon contact, the driver provided his insurance card and a Texas Identification card. The officer could detect the odor of burned marijuana emitting from the truck and asked the driver about it. He told the officer he had smoked an hour before and had thrown a joint out of the window when he saw the officer catching up to him. At that time, the driver was removed from the vehicle, searched, placed in handcuffs and placed in the back seat of the patrol car. The passenger was removed from the vehicle, searched, placed in handcuffs and sat on the front bumper of the police car. A search of the interior of the truck revealed a small piece of a joint in the ashtray. The amount was unusable. A computer check of the driver returned with an active parole violation warrant and a municipal court warrant. The dispatcher was able to confirm the parole violation warrant. The passenger was released at the scene and the driver requested that his truck be released to his boss. A Vehicle Impound form was completed and his boss signed the form. The driver was given a verbal warning for the speeding charge. The driver was booked on the warrants.
