## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Assist other Agency**

**Date: 01.26.14**

**Time: 1619 hours**

**Location: 13700 blk San Pedro**

The dispatcher requested officers check the area of the 100 block of Bitters Road for a grass fire. While responding, an officer noticed the smoke appeared to be coming from behind the Denny's in the 13700 block of San Pedro. The officer pulled into the car wash where several people were standing and pointing. SAFD pulled in behind the officer. The officer found a small shack that was on fire along with surrounding trees and brush. SAPD arrived and the officer informed them that the area of the fire belonged to San Antonio. The HCV officer resumed patrol.

An employee of a local business called to report a theft. The officer arrived and spoke to the employee. The employee reported that sometime after 1600 someone had cut a security cable which held 2 electric plumbing snakes. It appeared the cable was cut in order to steal the electrical equipment. The business has video cameras and the employee said they would provide the footage to the police.

**Offense: Forgery**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

An officer was contacted on the city cell phone by a restaurant manager who reported a customer had attempted to use a counterfeit \$20 dollar bill to pay for his food. The officer arrived and

spoke to the manager who said she took the \$20 from the male customer at the drive through window and immediately realized it was counterfeit. The officer contacted the male who said he did give the \$20 to manager but had no idea it was a counterfeit bill. The male told the officer he had gotten the bill from money returned to him from a Super Bowl pot at his workplace. The officer took the \$20 from the manager and upon closer inspection; it appeared to have been made on a photo copier. The bill was checked with a counterfeit money pen which indicated it was a forged note. The male asked the officer to check the remainder of his money with the counterfeit money pen and none of the currency he had showed to be counterfeit. Both the manager and the male gave written statements concerning the incident. The manager was given a property receipt for \$20 and it was transported to the Hill Country Village Police Department and secured in the property room.

**Offense: Driving While Intoxicated**

**Date: 02.01.14**

**Time: 0113 hours**

**Location: 100 blk Tower Drive**

At approximately 0113, an officer observed a vehicle traveling southbound in the 400 block of Tower Drive. The vehicle was in front of the officer's patrol car and was traveling in the same direction. The officer noted that the vehicle appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed. The officer activated the radar and registered the speed at 48 mph in a 30 mph zone. The officer locked the speed of the vehicle into the radar, but the speed of the vehicle continued to increase. The officer began to pursue the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop in the 100 block of Tower Drive. The officer approached the vehicle and could immediately detect a very strong odor of alcohol emitting from the male driver. The male's speech was very slurred and muffled as if he had something inside of his mouth. When asked, the male had a difficult time trying to retrieve his insurance paperwork. The male fumbled through the paperwork and kept dropping the papers in his lap. The male was asked if he had been drinking, to which he replied that he had drank about 5 drinks. The officer conducted a field sobriety test which the driver failed. During one of the tests, the male almost fell over backwards and the officer had to grab his arm to prevent him from falling like a tree. The male was taken into custody, placed in handcuffs and put in the back seat of the patrol vehicle. During the vehicle inventory, the officer found a cold beer next to the driver's seat. The male was taken downtown where he gave a breath specimen. The specimen revealed the driver's blood alcohol content was over the legal limit. The male was booked into jail.
