Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws/Wanted Person

Date: 02.06.13

Location: 300 blk Tower Drive

An officer observed a vehicle traveling on Tower Drive bearing an expired registration sticker dated 04/2011. A traffic stop was initiated on the vehicle and contact was made with the driver. The driver told the officer he did not have an active driver's license and the vehicle insurance card was not in the truck. A computer check showed the driver to have a suspended license as well as a warrant. The driver was cited for violations and arrested for the warrant.

Officers were dispatched to a residence for a female being assaulted by her boyfriend. The resident answered the door and it was apparent he had just woken up. An officer informed him why the police were called and he didn't know what the officers were talking about. He said there was no one in the house but him. The officers asked the resident if they could look through the house to confirm there was no female at the location. The resident granted permission and officers did not find anyone else in the house. The lead officer apologized for the inconvenience. The lead officer had dispatch call the caller back on the telephone. Dispatch said the phone was no longer in service. The lead officer believed the caller may have given a wrong address to dispatch since in addition to the address, there was an apartment "A" included in the address section. The officers resumed patrol.

Offense: Assist other Agency
Date: 02.08.13
Time: 2140 hours
Location: 16300 blk San Pedro

A HPPD officer received a call for a female that was missing. A HCV officer was dispatched to assist HPPD. Upon arrival to the location the HPPD contacted his complainant. He advised that he had been at the Valero on San Pedro with his wife. His wife got mad and ran across the expressway. The complainant said his wife has not been taking her medication correctly. The complainant gave a description of his wife to the officers. The officers checked the area and could not find the female.

Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
Date: 02.09.13
Time: 0209 hours
Location: 14800 blk San Pedro

An officer observed a vehicle in the parking lot of a closed business. The officer initially suspected the male individual may have been arguing with the female so the officer approached the vehicle. The officer could see the male lean against the passenger seat, with the door still open, as if trying to hide something. The officer made contact with the male, who presented a prison inmate identification card, relating that was his only current form of identification. The female was asked for identification and provided a similar prison identification card, stating she did not have her driver's license on her. The officer conducted a computer check of both parties using their names and dates of birth. They both showed to be clear of any warrants but both had extensive arrests for drug related and theft/burglary offenses. For officer safety, the officer conducted a pat down search of the male and discovered a clear drug syringe with suspected residue, inside of his front left pocket. The male was detained and placed inside the back seat of the patrol vehicle while the officer was still trying to determine what was happening between the couple. While talking with the female, she had the appearance of being on drugs, which she denied. Her eyes were wide, she was nervous and rambled as she spoke. The female kept rubbing and scratching her arms. The female stated it was due to being nervous around police officers. Due to recent thefts and burglary of buildings in the area, the female was asked for permission to search her vehicle, which she granted. While searching the vehicle, the officer discovered two clear plastic drug syringes and a glass smoking pipe, both with suspected residue. The items were located under the front driver's seat where the female had been sitting. Also discovered inside her purse were six assorted credit cards issued to various cardholders, none of which were issued to her or the male. The female stated the credit cards were given to her by a friend in order to purchase gas for her vehicle. The female eventually stated that she believed the person who had given her the credit cards had probably obtained them fraudulently. The officer secured all the drug paraphernalia and logged it into evidence and secured the paraphernalia in the evidence room for safekeeping. The officer secured the six credit cards, logged them in as evidence and placed them in the evidence room for safekeeping until it could be determined if they were stolen. The male and female were issued citations for the Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and were released. This case is under investigation.
