Offense: Shots Fired

Date: 02.08.16

Time: 0030 hours

Location: 500 blk West Bitters Road

Officers were dispatched to patrol the 500 block of W. Bitters Road in reference to a resident who reported she had heard shots fired from the direction of the business behind her home. Officers patrolled the business complex on foot and found no indication of criminal activity.

Offense: Burglary of a Building

Time: 0555 hours

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

An officer was dispatched to a tire store at 0555 hours for an activated burglar alarm. He arrived on scene and found the building to be secure. He noted that the roll up door in the southwest corner of the building was cracked at the bottom several inches. He attempted to lift the door and found it to be secured. A second officer received a phone call at 0713 hours from the tire store manager. The manager reported that there had been an attempted burglary at the location. Upon arrival contact was made with the manager who reported that the roll up door on the southwest corner of the building was slightly ajar and the padlock that was on the door was cut and laying on the ground inside the location. The officer went inside and observed the cut padlock and the sliding lock mechanisms on either side of the door were bent and damaged. The officer had the manager attempt to lift the door and he was able to open the door completely with effort. The manager had an employee conduct a preliminary inventory to determine if anything was missing. The employee was able to confirm that a total of 20 Nitto brand tires were missing from the area near the roll up door. The cut padlock was seized as evidence.

Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

A vehicle was stopped for speeding. The officer asked the driver for his license and insurance. The driver provided his current insurance, but stated he did not have a license due to surcharges due. The driver did have a Texas ID card which he provided the officer. A computer check did not show a valid license for the driver. The return also showed nine (9) active suspensions on his ID card. Since the driver had current insurance, the officer allowed him to call family members who made the location and picked him and his truck up. The driver was issued citations for Speeding, No DL, and DWLI.
