## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Assist other Agency**

**Date: 02.15.16**

**Time 0337 hours**

**Location: 16300 blk San Pedro**

Officers were dispatched to a hotel in Hollywood Park in reference to a theft of service call. HCVPD was dispatched to Hollywood Park because HPPD officers were on another call and out of the area. HCV officers arrived and contacted the cab driver who stated he had driven his male passenger to the hotel and the male was refusing to pay for the fare because he had lost his wallet. The male's girlfriend was in the room rented in the male's name and was able to come down and pay the fare to the driver. HPPD Officers arrived on scene and released the male into the care and custody of his girlfriend.

**Offense: Suspicious Person**

**Location: 14000 blk Mint Trail**

An officer received a cell phone call from a resident. The resident reported an adult male, in his late teens or early 20's, knocked on her door and asked if she wanted to purchase books and magazines for a fundraising event for local charities. The resident stated the subject did not have any literature about the fundraising event. The resident had asked the subject if she could donate money or purchase the books and magazine on the Internet. The subject told her she could not. The resident thought this incident was odd and suspicious so when the subject left she called the police to report it. Before the subject left, he asked her about the neighborhood and asked if her neighbors left their front gates open. The resident felt like the subject was taking mental notes of the vehicles in her driveway and to see who else lives at her residence. The resident described the subject as 5'6 to 5'8 in height, approximately 150 pounds, brown hair, brown eyes, a couple of small tattoos on his arms (unknown), wearing a black "Polo Style" shirt and tan pants. The

officer spoke to a neighbor who reported the same. The officer stayed in the area and searched for the male but he was not found.

**Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia**

**Date: 02.19.16**

**Time: 1505 hours**

**Location: 13800 blk San Pedro**

Officers received a phone call from an employee of a business in reference to a male in the store who appeared to be highly intoxicated. Employees were concerned that the male would leave the location and cause a wreck. The officers saw a male matching the description exiting the store. Contact was made with the male who was identified at that time. The male was very jumpy, continually twitched during the conversation, and kept snorting. Based on training and experience, officers believed that the male was under the influence of some type of narcotic. An officer walked over to the male's vehicle and could clearly see, lying on the front driver's seat, a piece of aluminum foil that was burned and a lighter. The officer recognized these items as narcotic paraphernalia so the male was placed in handcuffs and searched. Officers began a search of the male's vehicle and located a cut straw with white residue in the front driver's side door handle. In the trunk they found a brown bag that contained several syringes and a cut soda can that showed burn marks. A second cut straw with white residue was found inside a laptop case. All of the items found are commonly associated with the use of narcotics. The male was issued a Hill Country Village Municipal Summons for Possession of Narcotic Paraphernalia. Based on the male's actions and the located paraphernalia, officers felt that the male was not in full control of his physical and mental faculties and therefore should not operate a motor vehicle. The male contacted a friend who arrived and took possession of the vehicle. The male was released to his friend.

**Offense: Criminal Mischief**

**Date: 02.20.16**

**Time: 1450 hours**

**Location: 200 blk Winding Way**

Officers were dispatched to an address on Tomahawk Trail for a 911 Hang Up call. While en-route to that location, the dispatcher placed the 911 hang up call on hold and dispatched officers to an address on Winding Way for a disturbance. Both officers arrived and were met in the driveway by a female. The female stated her ex-boyfriend had been at the location and became angry with her. The ex-boyfriend grabbed a metal tool and began smashing the female's vehicle with it. He broke the front windshield of the vehicle and at that time the female attempted to call 911 on her cell phone. The ex-boyfriend then grabbed her cell phone and threw it on the ground smashing it. The ex-boyfriend then proceeded to smash the hood of the vehicle, along with the rear window and passenger side mirror. The female's friend witnessed this and was able to record it on her cell phone. This case is under investigation.
