Offense: Information

Date: 02.15.15

Time: 1700 hours

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

An officer was dispatched to a burglary of a vehicle at a local business. The dispatcher related that the Complainant had departed the business and wished to make the report over the phone. The officer made telephone contact with the female who related that her black purse had been removed from underneath the back seat of her truck while she was inside of the gym by person(s) unknown. The female further stated that she had left the gym to retrace her steps to see if she had left the purse at Wal-Mart which was her last stop before the gym. The female stated that nothing else from the truck had been removed. Her Wal-Mart bags were still in the vehicle. The female said that her truck did not appear to have any damage but did notice a small dent adjacent to the locking mechanism/door handle frame. The officer was unable to verify any signs of a crime and explained to the female that he would take her information on the suspected burglary and pass it on to HCVPD CID. The female was given a case number and the officer resumed patrol.

A resident walked into HCV City Hall to make a police report on her son's laptop being stolen. The officer gathered all the information she had on the incident. The resident said the laptop had been stolen between 2012 and 2013. The officer gave her a case number and then resumed patrol. The son was needed by police for further information.

Offense: Possession of Marijuana**Date: 02.19.15****Time: 1428 hours****Location: 14800 blk San Pedro**

An officer observed a pickup truck displaying an inspection sticker with the date of 11/2013 traveling in the 100 block of Tower Drive. The officer conducted a traffic stop on the truck. The officer contacted the driver and explained the nature of the stop. The driver explained to the officer that he had just purchased the truck and didn't realize the sticker was expired. The driver did not have any paperwork confirming the purchase of the truck. When the officer asked him for his license and insurance, he provided the officer with his expired Texas ID card. The officer asked him about his license and he said he has never had a Texas license. The driver did not have proof of insurance with him either, but he was able to provide proof through his cell phone. Due to the fact that the driver did not have a license, the officer asked the front seat passenger for his information. The passenger provided the officer with his name and date of birth, but the officer was unable to locate anything other than a Texas ID card for him. Due to the fact that neither man had a valid license, the officer informed the driver that he would be impounding the truck. The officer told him to call for a ride. At that time, the officer asked the two occupants to exit the truck so he could complete a vehicle inventory. When the passenger was exiting the truck, he asked the driver if he wanted his lunch box that was on the back seat. The officer informed the driver that he would need to wait until the vehicle inventory was completed to remove any items. While conducting the inventory, the officer came across a black sweatshirt on the driver front seat. Inside the front pocket was a pack of water melon flavored cigarillos. Inside the packaging was all of the tobacco, but no cigarillos. There was also what appeared to be the top of a clear plastic bag. As the officer picked up the black and green lunch box, he could smell the odor of Marijuana coming from inside. Inside the top mesh portion of the lunch box was a small clear plastic bag containing a green leafy substance. The substance inside the bag was emitting the odor of marijuana. The officer stopped the inventory and walked to the rear of the truck where driver and passenger were waiting with another officer. The officer asked the driver if the lunch box was indeed his and he confirmed that it was. The officer asked him if he knew why he was being arrested and he said it was because of the marijuana. A test kit showed the substance to be marijuana. The driver was arrested and booked into jail.

Offense: Attempted Robbery**Date: 02.21.15****Time: 0105 hours****Location: 15600 blk San Pedro**

An officer responded to an attempted strong arm robbery on the corner of Paso Del Norte and San Pedro. The Bexar County Dispatcher advised that the victim would be waiting for law enforcement. The suspect was described as a male wearing a black and white Spur's jersey and blue jean pants. The officer made contact with male victim and obtained additional information on the incident. The victim stated that he was riding his bike home when an unknown male called out to him on the corner of Paso Del Norte and San Pedro. Once the victim approached the corner, the male suspect lunged toward the victim and yelled "I have a gun give me your wallet". The suspect took a hold of the victim's neck and attempted to throw him off of the bike. The

victim broke free from the assailant's grip and sped off southbound on San Pedro. The suspect was last seen running northbound on San Pedro. The victim said he did not see weapon nor received any injuries during the incident. Additional descriptors were obtained by the victim. A search for the suspect was conducted with the assistance by other agencies within the area. The suspect was not found.
