## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Information**

**Date: 02.22.15**

**Time: 2025 hours**

**Location: 15200 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a Burglary of a Vehicle at a local church. Information on the computer indicated that a female suspect had departed in a black Ford Explorer, heading North on San Pedro. The officer responded and upon arrival, the officer met with the male caller. The male stated that some of the kids came into the church and said a female was trying to open all of the car doors. The male said that he came outside and saw an unknown female standing in front of his Toyota Sienna smoking a cigarette. The male described the female as possibly being in her 30's, slim, wearing glasses and a dark jacket. The male said he noticed the interior dome light in his van was on. As he was trying to figure out what was happening, the female got into the driver's seat of a black Ford Explorer and departed the parking lot. The male was able to obtain the license plate number which he gave to the officer. The male never saw the female inside of his vehicle although the passenger door was ajar and it did not appear that anything in the vehicle was missing. A check of the area for the vehicle was met with negative results. No further action was taken and the officer resumed normal patrol.

### **Offense: Damaged Property**

While doing a business check, an officer found one of the windows of a dental office to be shattered. It appears it may have been shot with a BB gun. The glass was shattered but still

intact within the frame. The officer did not contact the owner since it was 3a.m. and the officer didn't know if they were already aware of the damaged window. The officer resumed patrol.

**Offense: Disturbance**

Officers were dispatched to a local business for a reported family disturbance. Details of the call indicated a female subject was having a psychotic episode inside a vehicle parked in the parking lot of the location. Upon arrival, contact was made with a male who related his wife had suffered a stroke a few years ago and was unable to speak and had broken her hip a few months back so she wasn't very mobile. The male said he arrived at the business and left his wife in the vehicle while he stepped inside the business for a brief time. Upon his return to the vehicle, his wife had taken the keys and was sitting on them and acting erratically. The male said he telephoned the wife's doctor who in turn called the police for assistance. The male related his wife was continuously moving around inside the vehicle and clapping her hands which are not her normal behavior. An officer observed the behavior of the female which appeared erratic but neither her behavior nor her actions were a threat to herself or others. Officers on scene told the male that they would aid him in getting back on the road, however if he wanted his wife to seek medical attention, he would either have to drive her himself to the hospital or officers would. The male related he would transport his wife to a local hospital and seek treatment for her. The male asked if the officers could assist in moving his wife from the front seat to the rear seat, which they did. No further action was taken.

**Offense: Suspicious Vehicle**

An officer was doing a business check at a storage facility when he came across a vehicle in the secured portion. Most renters do not have access to the secure area when it is after hours. The officer observed an adult female sitting in her vehicle and talking on her cell phone. The officer made contact with the female who stated she had loaded some equipment from her storage unit for an early morning company event. The female told the officer that she got special permission to enter the secure area from the storage manager. The officer did not see any signs of criminal activity and the female was free to go. The officer resumed patrol.
