Offense: Wanted Person

An officer observed a flatbed trailer being pulled in the 200 block of Tower Drive. The trailer did not have any type of license plate attached to it. The officer stopped the trailer and identified the driver of the truck pulling the trailer. Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance/Possession of Marijuana

An officer saw a vehicle which was about to exit a local business. When the driver saw the marked patrol car, he reversed back into the driveway and waited for the officer to pass. The vehicle then entered the roadway and cut across all lanes of traffic and entered the turnaround lane. The officer followed and did a license plate check on the vehicle which did not show to be currently registered. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle and the driver continued for a short distance before stopping. The officer made contact with the male driver and sole occupant of the vehicle. Upon contact, the male kept reaching his right hand under the front seat and his left hand between the driver's door and the seat. The officer ordered him to show his

hands. When he opened his right hand he revealed a blue and white marijuana pipe he was attempting to conceal under the seat. The officer was also able to observe a pill bottle between the seats. The officer asked the male to provide his driver's license to which he stated he did not have it with him. The officer observed his Social Security card and asked for that to be able to identify him. He handed the officer the Social Security card and the officer had him exit the vehicle. In the vehicle, the officer found marijuana and pills. The officer asked the male what the pills were and he stated he was not sure what they were. He originally stated the marijuana was his, but then stated it was not his and he had found it in his grandmother car. A computer check showed the male had a suspended driver's license. The male was arrested for the drugs and booked into jail.

Officers were dispatched to a welfare check on Ashin Way. Bexar County dispatch received a 911 cell phone call transfer from San Antonio Police dispatch. The call came from an AT&T mobile number. Officers responded to the residence to find the house was quiet and all the lights were out.
