Directly behind the suspect, the officer observed a large plate glass window was broken. An officer detained the suspect and while walking the suspect out of the store, the suspect was begging the employees not to press charges. The suspect was placed in the back of the patrol car. The store manager reported he had observed the suspect on the store surveillance camera place a laptop computer inside the front of his pants. The manager and an employee were able to lock both doors of the business. The manager and employee approached the suspect as he walked toward the front door. The suspect then removed the laptop from inside of his pants and asked the manager to let him go. When the suspect was told that the police would be called, he attempted to run out the front door but was unable to because it was locked. At that point the suspect ran to the second locked door and was unable to exit. The suspect became desperate and punched the plate glass window causing it to break. A computer check showed the suspect had a criminal history. He was also found to have a warrant for his arrest. The suspect began to complain of a shortness of breath. He was checked out by EMS who determined the suspect was fine. The suspect was booked into jail for the charges listed above.
