Calls of Interest

Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws

Date: 03.13.16

Time: 1333 hours

Location: South Tower Drive @ Winding Way

An officer was running stationary traffic enforcement at the intersection of South Tower Drive and Winding Way when he observed a white in color vehicle traveling northbound on South Tower Drive. The vehicle failed to stop at the clearly posted stop sign and made a right hand turn onto Winding Way. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle and contact was made with the male driver. Upon contact with the driver he only cracked the driver's side window just enough for them to speak. The officer informed him of the reason for the stop and he provided his Texas Driver's License and Proof of Financial Responsibility. A computer check on the driver showed he had one active suspension of his Texas Driver's License. The driver was issued citations for Disregard Stop Sign, Failure to Display Vehicle Registration and Driving While License Invalid. The officer asked the driver to exit the vehicle in order to conduct an inventory of the vehicle before towing. The driver told the officer that he was not comfortable with him conducting the inventory. The officer informed him that an inventory before impound was mandated by department policy. The driver submitted and the officer began the inventory. The officer immediately noticed the smell of burned marijuana emitting from the vehicle and the officer detained the driver in handcuffs pending investigation. The driver was searched and placed in the back of the patrol car. Inside the vehicle the officer was able to observe what appeared to be ash on the floorboard as well as multiple bottles of Visine; however, no marijuana was located. Inside the driver's wallet the officer observed credit cards that were not in the driver's name. When asked about the cards, the driver stated "No comment." Based on the cards not bearing the driver's name, the officer seized them for safekeeping and provided him with a HCVPD Property Receipt. The driver was released from custody and the vehicle was impounded. A copy of the report was forwarded to CID.

A Bexar County Deputy had conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that had three occupants.
