## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Driving While Intoxicated**

**Date: 03.16.14**

**Time: 0250 hours**

**Location: 16400 blk San Pedro**

While on routine patrol, an officer observed a vehicle exit US 281 onto the access road. The vehicle crossed the solid white line with the driver side tire two times while exiting the freeway. The vehicle then accelerated and the officer paced the car between 60 and 66 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. As the officer started to pull the vehicle over, the vehicle turned into a parking lot and ran up on the curb, pulling into a parking space. The officer made contact with the male driver and could immediately smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from inside of the vehicle. The male had blood shot watery eyes and was fumbling looking for his license and insurance. He passed his license three times prior to locating it. The officer asked the male to step out of the car and speak to him at the back of the car. While speaking to the male outside of the car away from the other occupants the officer could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his mouth as he spoke. The male told the officer he was coming from a bar and said he had a few drinks. While standing behind his car, the male had a side to side sway. The male submitted to a field sobriety test which he failed. The male was placed under arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. The male was booked into jail while his passengers took a taxi to their destination.

**Offense: EMS Call**

**Location: 14800 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a medical office for a report of a 4 year old male having an allergic reaction. Upon arrival, contact was made with clinic staff who related the juvenile was awake and alert but would need transport to a local area hospital by EMS. EMS arrived on scene and transported the juvenile male to North Central Baptist Hospital for further evaluation. The officer resumed patrol.

**Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance**

An officer drove into a business parking lot and observed a vehicle with a damaged windshield parked with one male occupant in the driver's seat. The officer did a computer check which showed the license plate was registered to another vehicle. The officer approached the male in the front seat to inquire about the fictitious registration plate. The officer introduced himself to the male and explained concerns on the fictitious registration displayed on the vehicle. The suspect stated "Yeah I know, that's who I was on the phone with trying to get it right". The male continued to explain that he has owned the vehicle for a year and has yet to register the vehicle. The male told the officer he had been continuously replacing the temporary plates with the assistance of the alleged previous owner. When the officer asked to speak with the previous owner, the male said he was unable to contact him. The officer asked the male to step out of the vehicle and told him he was being detained. Once the male was out of the vehicle the officer asked for consent to search. The male consented to the search. During the search the officer found a cut straw with what appeared to be residue of a narcotic. The officer asked the male where the narcotics were located. The male informed the officer that the narcotic was speed and it was in his rear pocket. To clarify, the officer asked if the narcotic was Methamphetamine to which the male said it was. The narcotic was tested and found to be Methamphetamine. The male was arrested on the narcotic charge and the vehicle was impounded.

**Offense: Emergency Detention**

**Date: 03.21.14**

**Time: 1656 hours**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a local restaurant for a female that appeared to be having mental issues. Upon arrival contact was made with a female who was being evaluated by EMS. EMS advised that the female appeared to be intoxicated but was otherwise healthy. The female told the officer that she was at the location to meet a man named "AJ" so she could see her kids. The female was unaware of where she was or how she ended up there. The female provided the officer with a contact number for "AJ" and the officer was able to make contact with him. "AJ" is a CPS case worker who was supposed to supervise a meeting between the female and her children at a different restaurant on Jones Maltsberger. The officer told "AJ" that the female was severely intoxicated and that she was most likely going to be transported to University Hospital for a mental health evaluation. The female had told the officer that she has "mental issues" and that she frequently tries to kill herself. Due to the female's mental state, as well as her level of

intoxication, the officer took her into custody for an Emergency Detention. The female was transported to University Hospital. The officer resumed patrol.
