## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Wanted Person**

**Date: 03.24.15**

**Time: 1734 hours**

**Location: 100 blk Winding Way**

An officer stopped a moving truck for speeding and running a stop sign. The officer explained to the male driver the nature of the stop and requested his license and rental agreement paperwork. The male provided the officer with a Texas ID card. He stated he did not have the rental paperwork for the truck and he had lost his license. The officer conducted a computer check on the driver. The officer was able to pull up a license issued to him from the State of Texas that had expired in 2013. The license also showed to have three (3) active suspensions. Along with the license status, the return showed two active warrants for the driver's arrest out of the City of San Antonio Municipal Court. All three of the warrants were verified and confirmed to be active. The truck was impounded and the driver was jailed.

**Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance**

**Date: 03.24.15**

**Time: 2100 hours**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

While on routine patrol, an officer observed a vehicle parked in the shopping center parking lot located in the 15700 block of San Pedro. The vehicle was running, the lights were on and the female operator was sitting in the driver's seat. It appeared as though the female was asleep. The officer drove past the vehicle and after several minutes, returned. The vehicle was in the

same position and the female still appeared to be asleep. The officer activated the patrol vehicle emergency lights and approached the vehicle to see if the female was alright. The officer called to the female but was unable to wake her up. While looking inside the vehicle from outside the driver's door, the officer observed a package containing a syringe lying on the floorboard behind the driver's seat. The officer returned to the patrol vehicle and logged in the traffic stop. The officer again approached the vehicle and opened the driver's door and was able to wake the female. She seemed excited and surprised. She kept moving her arm around, saying that it was asleep. She also seemed very nervous at the officer's presence. The officer asked her to step out of the vehicle and since he did not smell any alcohol, he asked the female if she was taking any drugs or had any drugs in her possession. The female stated "no, you can check my purse". The officer walked the female to the rear of the vehicle and while checking her purse he discovered a used syringe. The officer conducted a check of her vehicle. The officer discovered a syringe, still sealed in the package on the floorboard behind the driver's seat. Also discovered in that location was an open packet of Fentanyl Transdermal System (50 mcg/h). The packet was empty. While checking the front passenger seat, the officer discovered a silver/black make-up box containing two sealed syringe packages and a sealed packet of Fentanyl Transdermal System (50 mcg/h) marked "prescription only". The female stated that those items did not belong to her. The female also stated that she had come from New Braunfels to give a ride to a person she hardly knew. That person had asked her to park at the location on San Pedro and wait for him to return. She did not know where he was supposed to be going. The female further stated that he must have put the items in the vehicle. The female was taken into custody for Possession of Controlled Substance and transported to HCVPD for processing. The female was advised of her rights and acknowledged that the makeup box was hers but again stated that she did not know how the items got inside the box. The sealed Fentanyl Transdermal System was taken into evidence and placed in the evidence room for safekeeping. The syringes and open packet of Fentanyl were seized and placed in the property room for proper disposal. The vehicle operated by was inventoried and impounded. The female was transported to the Magistrate's Office and booked.

**Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle**

**Date: 03.28.15**

**Time: 2200 hours**

**Location: 15800 blk San Pedro**

An officer was performing a routine patrol when he was flagged down by a complainant who reported her vehicle burglarized. The female complainant stated she arrived at the restaurant at approximately 1945hrs and believed she had locked the vehicle. After returning to her car she realized it was not secured and several items were now missing. No force entry was observed. Items taken were described as one 7" Coby tablet, one black headphone (unknown make), one pink and yellow girl's school bag, and one black handbag containing makeup. No other vehicle's appeared to be burglarized.

**Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle**

**Time: 1542 hours**

**Location: 15700 Blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a burglary of vehicle report. Upon arrival, the officer made contact with the female victim who advised that she parked her car and went for a run at 10:30 am and returned to the vehicle at 2:45 pm. The female said that when she left for the run she had placed her purse on the front passenger floorboard and covered it up with a jacket and her gym bag. When she returned she found that her purse was missing and there were multiple scratches to the inside of the front passenger window and on the outside of the window. During the investigation the officer observed that the front driver door lock was punched out and the female stated that the damage was new. The female related that there was \$180.00 cash in the purse, two credit cards, two phone cases, and a watch.
