## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Open Door**

**Date: 03.29.15**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

An officer was doing a business check when he found a door that was unlocked. Officers entered the business and located no one inside. Nothing appeared to be missing from the business. The officer observed many computers throughout the business that were not disturbed. The officer did not observe any signs of criminal activity. It appeared an employee accidentally forgot to secure the front door when leaving the property. The officer located a business card of the business owner in the main office of the business. The business card had the owner's cell phone number on it. The officer made 20 attempts to make contact with the business owner but was unsuccessful. The officer left a note on the desk but was unable to secure the door. The officer resumed patrol.

An officer stopped a vehicle for an expired registration. He contacted the female driver and asked her for her license and insurance. She explained that she had left all of that at home. The officer provided the female with a copy of the impound

sheet and explained what she would need to do in order to retrieve her vehicle. The female was picked up by her boyfriend.

The male said just before he went to the shower he saw a male approximately 5'10 in height near his locker and believed he may be the person who took his handgun. The citizen was unable to give any further description of this individual. This case is under investigation.
