Offense: Welfare Concern

An officer received a call on the city cell phone from the manager of a local business. The manager reported there was a male outside the doors of her business and he appeared to be intoxicated or on drugs. The officer immediately noted signs of intoxication from the male. He stated that he had been drinking and was on his way to work. The male was incoherent, had a strong odor of alcohol emitting from his breath and was unable to maintain his balance. The officer detained the male for his safety and transported him to HCVPD so that a responsible party could be contacted to retrieve him. While en route to HCVPD, the male's mother called his cell phone. The officer spoke with his mother who agreed to respond and take custody of her son. The mother arrived and the male was released to her. No further action was taken.
