## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Credit Card Abuse**

**Date: 04.13.15**

**Time: 1038 hours**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

A male called into City Hall to file a police report. He stated that sometime between 1500 and 1600 hours on 04/02/2015, he had gone to the gym to work out. He returned to his locker sometime around 1500 hours. The male stated he noticed two of his credit cards, a Master Card issued through Sam's Club and an American Express from Costco, had been taken from his wallet. He also said a third card had been moved and placed in the wrong slot of his wallet. He went downstairs and notified the management of the missing cards. They generated an internal report and called for the police, but the male had to go to work and departed the location prior to police arrival. The male went on to say that on Monday, April 6, 2015, he received a call from the credit companies attempting to verify his use of the cards at several different locations. He told them he had not. The male stated that he was able to resolve the charges with both credit card companies. The male does not know who may have taken his credit cards, but decided to call and make a police report over the phone on 04/13/2015. This case is under investigation.

**Offense: Burglary of a Habitation**

**Date: 04.13.15**

**Time: 1642 hours**

**Location: 400 blk Winding Way**

A homeowner telephoned city hall and requested an officer meet her at her residence for a burglary report. Upon arrival, contact was made with the owner and the handyman who related person(s) unknown had broken into the house and taken property without the consent of the

owner. The owner said the handyman had arrived on the property to check on the house which has been unoccupied for numerous months and upon arrival, he noticed the entry gate to the property and a garage door to be wide open. The handyman related this was not normal and upon walking around the residence, discovered a window pane had been removed from a back patio door. Upon closer inspection inside of the house, the handyman discovered all the interior doors in the house to be open, which was also not normal. The handyman related while checking the house, he went into the garage area of the location and discovered numerous items of lawn equipment and a washer and dryer had been stolen. The handyman related he then called the owner and notified her of his findings. The owner checked the inside of the house and all the furnishings appeared to be undisturbed, but confirmed the items described were missing. The owner related she and the handyman had been doing work to the house the past few months in order to utilize the property as a rental and that she currently used the house to store furnishings. The owner related the last time anyone was at the residence was on Easter Sunday for a family gathering until the handyman arrived to check on the home. The owner said the house does have an alarm system, but the alarm system was not activated. Evidence was collected at the scene.

**Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle**

**Date: 04.17.15**

**Time: 0800 hours**

**Location: 100 blk Powderhorn Trail**

An officer was dispatched to a vehicle burglary. The officer made contact with the resident who reported; between the hours of 1055 p.m. and 1130 p.m. an unknown individual entered his gated property and searched through his truck which was parked in his driveway. The resident said even though there were items of value in the truck, nothing was taken other than a small portable air compressor. The resident checked his entire property and did not find anything else missing. The resident has a surveillance system and was able to capture video of the unknown individual inside his truck and walking around on his property. The resident said he would provide police with the video as soon as possible.

**Offense: Burglary of a Building**

**Location: 100 blk Powderhorn Trail**

An officer was dispatched to a burglary. The resident reported he had discovered his storage building had been burglarized. At some point during the night of 4-16-2015, an unknown individual entered his gated property and searched through a storage building, barn, and possibly the attached garage. The resident said a number of tools were taken including two chainsaws, one tree trimming saw, one leaf blower, one hedge trimmer and a box containing extension cords and five Christmas light timers.
