Calls of Interest

Offense: Evading Arrest

Location: 14800 blk San Pedro

An officer attempted to initiate a traffic stop on a vehicle for exceeding the posted speed limit. While approaching the vehicle near the intersection of Thousand Oaks and US 281 N, the driver of the vehicle increased speed. The driver of the vehicle failed to stop at a red light at the intersection of Thousand Oaks and US 281 N as well as failed to stop at a red light at the intersection of Donella and US 281 N. The driver of the vehicle then entered the freeway portion of US 281 N and the officer continued to pursue. The driver of the vehicle greatly increased speed and the officer began to lose visual contact with the driver shortly after passing the intersection of US 281 N and N Loop 1604. As the officer approached the intersection of US 281 N and Encino Rio, he made the decision to terminate the pursuit due to unsafe road conditions as well as the non-felonious nature of the initial violation. After terminating the pursuit, he informed the dispatcher of the termination and BCSO deputies in the area said that they would be on the lookout for the vehicle.
