An officer saw a Black Kia Soul pass by him at high rate of speed. The officer estimated the vehicle to be traveling at approximately 80 MPH. An officer was on routine patrol and observed an operator of a motorcycle initiate a turn onto West Bitters Road without the use of his turn signal. The operator traveled west on West Bitters Road and initiated a lane change without utilizing his turn signal again. The officer initiated a traffic stop and the operator pulled over in the 800 block of West Bitters. The male operator and the female passenger on the back of the motorcycle stepped off the motorcycle. The officer approached the operator and requested his driver's license. The male initially stated he did not have his license and that he had left it at home. The male eventually related that he had his provisional driver's license on him but it did not indicate an endorsement for a motorcycle. The officer detected a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the male, more specifically, the backpack that the male was carrying. A search of the backpack revealed a cellophane baggie containing a green leafy substance suspected to be marijuana. The male was taken into custody. Several pieces of evidence were also collected. The evidence showed that the male was possibly selling marijuana and did not just have it for personal use. The motorcycle was impounded and the female was released from the scene. The marijuana was tested and showed to be positive. The male was processed and booked into jail.

An officer was contacted on the city cell about a truck that had been left in the back parking lot of a business. The officer saw that the vehicle had a buyer's plate on it. The paper plate was confiscated as evidence and the truck was released to the owner.
