An officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation. The officer made contact with the female driver. The driver was unable to produce her driver's license but did relay her name and date of birth. Upon running the name through the computer, it was revealed that the driver had five (5) outstanding municipal warrants issued through the city of San Antonio. The female was taken into custody. An inventory was conducted on her vehicle and a tow truck was contacted to impound the vehicle. The female was searched, placed in the patrol vehicle and transported to the Magistrate's Office for booking.

An unidentified motorist flagged an officer down and informed him of a one vehicle crash in the 100 block of Winding Way. The officer responded, and upon arrival discovered a vehicle had struck a tree and the engine compartment was on fire. The officer made a check of the vehicle and did not locate the driver or any passenger(s). He requested SAFD respond. The officer requested HPPD to assist in checking the area for the suspected driver. The officer informed the dispatcher that the vehicle had struck the tree causing the air bags to deploy and that the

suspected driver would possibly be injured. While responding to assist, HPPD attempted to make contact with a male subject that was walking on the east side of the church located in the 14100 block of San Pedro. HPPD stated that he exited his patrol vehicle and called the unidentified suspect to the patrol vehicle. The unidentified suspect began to walk toward the HPPD officer, then turned and ran away through the church complex and then west into the wooded area behind the church. HPPD further stated that he was able to get a look and the suspect who was bleeding from his arm. HPPD related the suspect was approximately 6', 150 pounds. The suspect was wearing blue jeans and a dark colored t-shirt with some print on the front. Several units continued to look for the suspect but were unable find him. The search was subsequently called off and all responding agencies resumed normal service.

An officer stopped a vehicle for an expired registration. The male driver provided the officer with an insurance card that confirmed the insurance had expired in 2014. The driver provided a Texas ID card and stated he didn't have his license. The officer asked him why and he said it was currently suspended.
