Offense: Assist other Agency

Date: 04.27.14

Time: 0026 hours

Location: 200 blk Robledo Verde

A HCV officer responded to the 200 blk of Robledo Verde in reference to a Hollywood Park Officer requesting assistance. While en route, the officer requested that officers respond quickly. The HCV officer used emergency equipment and conducted a code 3 run to assist the officer. When the HCV officer arrived on scene, he observed the suspect wrestling with two officers of the Hollywood Park Police Department. The suspect was on top of one HPPD officer while the other officers tried to get the suspect off of the officer. A fourth officer arrived and tased the suspect. Officers were able to take the suspect into custody. The suspect told the HCV officer that he was a high school and college wrestler and had some prior Mixed Martial Arts (MMA) experience. The suspect was booked into jail on various charges. The HCV officer resumed patrol.

Offense: Driving While Intoxicated

Location: 500 blk West Bitters Road

An officer observed a tan truck traveling south on San Pedro with the passenger side head light out and appeared to be traveling at a high rate of speed. The officer pulled out behind the vehicle and was able to track the vehicle on front radar at 58 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. The officer was having trouble catching the vehicle with other traffic on the road. The officer caught up to the vehicle as it turned onto W Bitters Road and the vehicle was traveling in the left lane between 50 and 55 MPH in a 40 MPH zone. The vehicle was unable to maintain a single lane of traffic and

crossed the dashed white line into the right lane multiple times quickly moving back into the left lane. The vehicle then moved into the right lane to pass a vehicle traveling in the left lane with no signal then moved back to the left lane again with no signal. The officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and made contact with the male driver. While speaking to the male, the officer could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his mouth as he spoke and he had blood shot watery eyes. The male was asked to do a field sobriety test which he failed. The male gave a breath sample and was over the legal limit. The driver was booked into jail.

Offense: Suspicious Person

Officers were dispatched to a local gym for a suspicious person loitering in the parking lot. Details of the call indicated a female member was followed to the gym by an older male and when she arrived and parked in the parking lot, the suspicious male began messing with the female's car. While en route to the location, business employees called back requesting officers cancel their response as the male subject was actually a gym member himself. The officers resumed patrol.

Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

An officer was on patrol in the 14000 block on San Pedro when he observed a red in color Ford F-150 traveling at what appeared to be a high rate of speed. The officer was able to activate the in car radar unit and confirmed that the vehicle was traveling 58 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. The officer activated the patrol unit's emergency equipment and a traffic stop of the vehicle was conducted. The officer made contact with the male driver. The driver appeared to be very nervous as he provided the officer with his Texas Driver's License and proof of financial responsibility. A computer check returned clear. Based on the driver's nervous behavior, the officer asked him if there was anything illegal in his vehicle, to which he responded, "No". The officer then asked the male if he would mind if the officer took a look inside the vehicle and he responded, "No" and exited the vehicle. In plain view on the center console was an opened Marlboro cigarette box. Inside the box were two small baggies, bearing the "Batman" logo that contained a white crystalline substance that had the appearance of methamphetamine. The driver was placed in handcuffs and searched. Three other baggies containing a white crystalline substance were located in his right front jacket pocket. When asked about the baggies, the male said that they were not his. The suspected drugs were tested and showed to be positive for methamphetamine. The vehicle was impounded and the male was booked for the drug charge.
