Calls of Interest

Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

Date: 05.10.16

Time: 0621 hours

Location: 14300 blk San Pedro

Officers were dispatched to a business for a vehicle burglary. The manager of the store reported that a friend of his had called him and asked him about the broken window on the F150 parked behind the business. The manager went to check and saw that someone had broken into the company truck. It appears the suspect first tried breaking the right front window but was unable to do so. There were marks on the front window made by a rock. The right rear window was broken and the large rock was on the rear floorboard of the truck. The manager did not know if anything had been taken from inside of the truck. Officers gathered evidence from the location and resumed patrol.

Offense: Wanted Person

An officer was in a police vehicle which is equipped with the Vigilant License Plate Reader system. The LPR system alerted on a vehicle parked in the parking lot of a local restaurant. The alert showed there were HCVPD warrants attached to the vehicle. The officer made contact with HCVPD court personal that were able to confirm the active warrants. As the officer circled around the parking lot he observed a female closing the trunk of the car and walking toward the front door of the business. The officer made contact with the female and was able to verify that

her name matched the name of the wanted person. The female was arrested and booked on the warrants.

Officers were dispatched to a local business for a suicidal male. Officers contacted a male in front of the business. The male told officers he had been kicked out of his apartment by his boyfriend. Due to this event, he was upset and had taken thirty (30) Xanax pills. When asked why he took the pills, the male said "because I want to kill myself." Due to the mentioned actions, EMS transported the male to a local hospital. The officer arrived shortly thereafter with an Application for Emergency Detention. The application was turned into the ER staff.

Offense: Emergency Detention

Date: 05.13.16

Time: 0641 hours

Location: 200 blk Hill Country Lane

Officers responded to a call for a suspicious person that came through the Hill Country Village PD patrol phone. The resident reported that there was a person at his door, whom he did not know, and the male was asking for a gun so that he could "defend himself". Upon arriving at the residence, officers made contact with the male who stated immediately that his father and grandmother had been murdered at his home and that he was working for the CIA. Due to the serious nature of the claim, officers informed BCSO dispatchers that SAPD should be sent to the home of record for the male for a welfare check of the family. SAPD responded and said everyone in the home was okay. It became apparent through the male's actions and words that he was suffering from mental illness and the male stated that he had been off of his prescribed medication for at least two days and was occasionally using methamphetamine. Due to the claims made by the male and based on the observation that he did not seem to comprehend his situation, the male was placed under emergency detention. While attempting to handcuff the male, he became combative and the officers were forced to use reasonable force to subdue him. The male was transported to a local hospital and released into the care and custody of the emergency room staff. The male's vehicle was impounded at the scene.
