## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Burglary of a Habitation**

**Date: 05.10.15**

**Time: 1330 hours**

**Location: 100 blk South Tower**

An officer was contacted on the city cell phone by a resident. The resident said he received a phone call today from his next door neighbor who told him that their garage had been recently broken into and that he should check his garage to see if it was okay. When the resident went to check his garage, he discovered that an unknown individual had entered his garage through an unlocked side door. It was discovered that several items had been stolen. The items were a Milwaukee power tool set, a Milwaukee skill saw, a gas powered blower, a gas powered weed eater, a box containing 25 extension cords, five socket sets, four wrench sets, a Yeti cooler, and an antique reel-to-reel tape player. Evidence was collected and photographs were taken at the crime scene.

### **Offense: Burglary of a Building**

**Date: 05.11.15**

**Time: 1405 hours**

**Location: 200 blk Crest Trail**

An officer responded to a residence and learned that the storage shed in the back yard had been entered without consent of the owner. An unknown person had pried the latch off of the storage

shed allowing access to the contents inside. Once inside the unknown suspect took several items. The resident does not know of any person who would have stolen his property. The resident is having renovations done at his house and there are numerous construction tools around the residence which were in plain sight. The resident reported that his contractors had arrived at his residence at approximately 0815 hours on 05/11/2015 and found tools scattered around the back yard but did not think anything was out of the ordinary. When the resident arrived at his home later in the day, he discovered the items had been stolen. He then notified police to file a report. The resident had already cleaned up the scattered items and repaired the damaged latch; therefore the officer was unable to obtain any fingerprints.

**Offense: Burglary of a Building**

**Date: 05.11.15**

**Time: 1910 hours**

**Location: 100 blk Tower Drive**

An officer was dispatched to a residence for a report of a burglary which had occurred overnight. Upon arrival, contact was made with the resident who related sometime in the last 24 hours; person(s) unknown had taken a chain saw from his storage shed without his consent. The resident related he went to his storage shed to get some tools and noticed the door to be open and the latch which padlocked the door to have been pried off the door. The resident said the only item he noticed missing was an Echo chain saw. He had last used the chain saw the night before (05-10-2015) to cut branches along his driveway. The officer informed him of numerous burglaries similar to his and requested he check his property for the missing items or any damage that may have been caused in order to gain entry onto his property. The resident did maintain serial numbers of the missing chain saw and would provide that information the following day. Prior to leaving the location, the resident flagged the officer down to inform him he did in fact find his missing chain saw along with a gas can that he didn't notice missing. Upon checking his property like the officer asked, he walked towards the back of his property which is adjacent to Crest Trail and located the chain saw and a gas can positioned next to a tree. The resident said he did not touch the items and immediately returned to the front of his property in order to signal the officer before he left. The resident gave consent for the officer to seize the two items for latent print processing. The items were returned to city hall and placed into property.

**Offense: Burglary of a Building**

**Date: 05.13.15**

**Time: 0706 hours**

**Location: 100 blk South Tower**

While on patrol, an officer observed the rolling door located on the front of the external garage at a residence was ajar approximately 3 feet. The officer was aware that there was no one at the home and due to the recent burglaries in the area the officer contacted the homeowner via telephone. The resident said that the garage doors should be closed. A check of the garage found a door and window on the south side of the structure open and signs of forced entry were observed on the door. While walking the property the officer observed forced entry on a storage shed located on the south side of the back yard. Located in the southeast corner of the backyard was a coiled up extension cord and directly in front of the sliding garage door was a can of WD-

40, a crowbar, and a wheelbarrow. When the resident arrived, it was discovered that four wheels and tires were missing from the north wall of the garage. Also, several assorted power tools were missing from the top of a locker in the south side of the garage. The resident reported there were numerous tools that were moved and out of place. The officer seized all of the tools that were clearly moved in order to process them for latent prints. The officer also took possession of the WD-40 can, safe handles, a metal piece from the sliding door, and two metal brackets that were located outside the open window. All of the evidence was bagged up and transported to HCVPD for processing.
