The female related that she had placed her purse in a locker and then went to the bathroom. Upon return, she reopened the locker and placed her shoes in it. The female reported there were no signs that the locker was broken into and that she remembered there was a female, in her early twenties, that was standing near her when she opened her locker both times. She believed that the female possibly saw the code and took the purse. This case is under investigation.
