## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Consumption of Alcohol by Minor**

**Date: 05.15.16**

**Time: 0230 hours**

**Location: 17000 blk San Pedro**

An officer initiated a traffic stop of a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on the access road of US HWY 281 N. In the vehicle there was a female minor passenger. The officer observed the female to be in what appeared to be an unconscious state in the passenger seat of the vehicle. The officer established that she was conscious and interviewed the minor. The officer determined, based on the glassy appearance of her eyes, trouble maintaining her balance while standing and the strong odor of alcoholic beverages emanating from her person that the female was under the influence of alcohol. The female presented a State of Texas ID showing she was in fact a minor. Being a minor and evidently under the influence of alcohol, she was issued a court summons for Consumption of Alcohol by a Minor. The female was released to the adult driver to be taken home.

**Offense: Assist other Agency**

**Location: US 281 N @ West Bitters Road**

Officers were standing in the parking lot of City Hall when they heard what sounded to be a vehicle traffic accident in the direction of US Hwy 281 N. One officer responded to the area and noticed a single vehicle accident on the southbound side of US Hwy 281 N, just prior to West Bitters Road. The second officer responded to the actual highway to block traffic. Bexar County Dispatch notified SAPD of the vehicle accident. One officer assisted SAPD Officers in obtaining

witnesses information. Witnesses reported that the vehicle was travelling in excess of 100 MPH before the crash. The female driver was arrested for DWI by SAPD.

**Offense: Possession of Drug Paraphernalia**

**Location: 300 blk West Bitters Road**

An officer stopped a vehicle for running a stop sign. The officer approached the vehicle and identified himself to the driver. The officer immediately detected an odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. The officer also noted the driver's eyes were glassy. The officer informed the male driver of why he had been stopped. While speaking to the driver, he spontaneously stated that he already has a court hearing for a speeding violation and drug paraphernalia charge in Austin. When asked if he had anything illegal in the vehicle, the driver's first response was no, then spontaneously stated that he did have a bong in the back seat. The officer requested identification from the passenger male passenger and returned to the patrol car to conduct a computer check. Both males came back clear. The officer returned to the vehicle and retrieved a black Adidas backpack from the back seat floorboard, directly behind the driver's seat. The backpack had the driver's name embroidered on the front. The bag was filled with at least 15 items used to smoke marijuana. The driver was cited and the paraphernalia was seized. The officer had them call for a ride since they had both admitted to recently smoking.

**Offense: Disturbance-Noise**

**Location: 200 blk Winding Way**

An officer received a call on the patrol phone about a loud party. The officer made contact with resident where a party was taking place. The resident was informed of the complaint. The resident was asked to lower the sound level to where it was not disturbing to neighbors. The officer remained in the driveway of the home near the street until he was able to hear that the music volume had been satisfactorily lowered.
