## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Driving While Intoxicated**

**Location: 100 blk South Tower Drive**

A male was leaving a local bar located in the 200 block of West Bitters Road. As he was leaving, he struck another vehicle. The person in the vehicle that was struck followed the male to obtain a license plate number. When the male realized he was being followed, he sped up. The male lost control of his truck and stuck a tree on South Tower Drive. Officers arrived and found the male to be stumbling around the truck. EMS was called to treat the male for minor injuries. The male failed a field sobriety test and was booked for Driving While Intoxicated.

A resident called to report two individuals fishing at the pond on the back portion of his property. The resident requested the males be warned not to enter the property anymore and to depart the area. The officers identified the males and released them with a warning. The officers resumed patrol.

**Offense: Damaged Property**

A local business employee called to report a possible vehicle accident. The employee reported a female left the store irritated and sped out of the parking lot after colliding with a parked motorcycle. The employee said that no one had witnessed the event but was certain she heard the sound of a motorcycle falling over during the female's departure. The owner of the motorcycle found his vehicle lying on the ground with damages that appeared to have been caused by a vehicle accident. The motorcycle owner said he would like to handle the matter civilly and be compensated for the repairs. The damages appeared to be estimated within the range of \$500-\$1000. The female's information was obtained and contact was made by cell phone. The officer informed the female that it was in her best interests to return to the scene of the accident and resolve the incident. The female complied with the request and returned to the location. The female told the officer she was distressed during the time of her departure and made a wide turn when her front bumper accidentally struck the motorcycle parked alongside the place of business. The female apologized to motorcycle owner and ensured that his vehicle would be repaired. Vehicle and contact information were exchanged between the two without further incident.

**Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance**

**Location: 14200 blk San Pedro**

An officer was on patrol when a Texas DPS Trooper came over the radio and requested a HCVPD officer to a local business. Upon arrival, the officer saw that the Trooper had one male detained in front of the store. The Trooper said he was sitting outside of the business when he observed store management escort a male out of the store. The trooper asked the store employee what was going on and the employee said the male was caught shoplifting. During a subsequent search of the male, a small purple box was located inside the waistband of his boxer shorts. The box was found to contain three small baggies with a white crystalline substance that the male said was methamphetamine. The drugs were field tested and the male was arrested. The male was booked into jail on drug charges and cited for the theft.
