## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Burglary of a Building**

**Date: 05.20.12**

**Time: 1938 hours**

**Location: 15300 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a local business for a Burglary of a Building. The building was cleared and there was no one found inside of the business. The front door glass had been smashed in with an unknown item. It appears the suspect(s) entered the building through the broken glass. The suspect(s) had stolen two computer monitors from the business and exited through the broken glass. The business owner did not notice anything else missing. The officer gathered evidence and photographed the crime scene. This case is under investigation.

The officer gathered evidence and photographed the crime scene. This case is under investigation.
