Offense: Violation State Vehicle Laws

Date: 05.25.15

Location: 100 blk Hill Country Lane

An officer stopped a vehicle for an expired registration violation. Upon contact with the male driver, it was determined that he did not have a Texas driver's license. He did have a Mexico license that had expired in March of 2014. As a result of the license status, the officer impounded the vehicle. The male was cited and released.

An officer was dispatched to a theft at a local business. The officer spoke with the Group Manager. The manager reported he had video surveillance of a male removing 5 outdoor video surveillance cameras that were set up near the roof of the business. The officer watched video footage with the manager and observed the unknown male committing the theft. The male had entered the parking lot operating a small 4 door Sport Utility Vehicle matching the description of a 2005 Mercury Mariner. The thief arrived at approximately 2230 hours on 05/27/15 and removed one video camera located near the southwest part of the building, then returned at approximately 0356 hours on 05/28/15 and removed 4 more cameras around the building. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Fraudulent Use of Identification

Date: 05.29.15

Time: 1356 hours

Location: 16200 blk San Pedro

Officers were investigating a theft report that was taken on 05/28/15. The officers drove to San Pedro North Mobile Home Park located at 16240 San Pedro in an attempt to locate the vehicle that was used during the commission of the theft as seen on surveillance video. The officers did not locate the vehicle on the property but while exiting the park, an officer observed a four door Mercury S.U.V. that matched the description of the vehicle used in the theft. The officer was able to see that the vehicle was occupied with one male subject in the driver seat. The male matched the description of the suspect. The officer made contact with the male subject who was identified. One of the officers recognized the driver from a previous theft incident and arrest, and knows that the male is known for stealing surveillance cameras. The officer read the male his Miranda Rights. The male waived his rights and agreed to speak with the officers. The driver gave consent for officers to check the vehicle for the stolen cameras. The search produced multiple identification cards which did not have the driver's name on them. Two Texas driver's license cards with another male's photo and information, a social security card, and a bank card that both matched one of the driver's license. Also located were two separate checks with other identifying information that did not show ownership to the driver. The driver was taken into custody by being placed in handcuffs for the offenses of Fraudulent Use/Possession of Identifying Info along with False DL/ID. The vehicle was impounded and the driver was transported to HCVPD for processing. Upon completion he was transported to the San Antonio Magistrates Office and booked.
