An officer was dispatched to a local business for a disturbance. Upon arrival, the officer contacted the shop owner who reported she had cancelled her alarm service with her previous company and hired a new company. She related that a technician from the previous company showed up at the scene and began to remove her security equipment. The owner related that, per her business contract with the previous company, she owned the equipment. Contact was made with the service technician who said he was given a work order by his company to remove the equipment and knew nothing else about the situation. The officer told both parties that the dispute over the security equipment was a civil matter that would need to be decided in civil court. Both parties agreed and the shop owner advised that she did not want the technician on the property. The technician agreed and departed the location. The officer resumed patrol.
