## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Welfare Concern**

**Date: 05.30.16**

**Time: 1618 hours**

**Location: 15800 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched for a welfare check on a 1 year old child locked inside a vehicle. The officer arrived and contacted the mother who stated she was getting ready to leave the location and started her vehicle. She placed her child in the vehicle and accidentally locked the door. Since the vehicle was running and the child did not appear in any distress, they waited for roadside assistance to make the location and unlock the door. SAFD also made location.

### **Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws**

An officer got a hit on a vehicle with the License Plate Reader. The LPR showed a warrant connected with that vehicle. The officer pulled behind the car and verified the plate on the vehicle matched the hit. The officer stopped the vehicle. The officer approached the vehicle and the male driver provided a Texas ID. A warrant was not found for the driver but he did have a suspended license with a previous conviction. The driver was arrested and the vehicle was impounded.

**Offense: Narcotic Law Violation**

**Date: 06.03.16**

**Time: 0538 hours**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

While on routine patrol and driving through the parking lot of a local business, an officer observed a maroon Toyota parked near the back of the business. The driver's side door was open and a person's leg was sticking out of the vehicle. It appeared that the person in the driver's seat was asleep or passed out. The officer stopped the patrol car and approached the vehicle to see if the driver was alright. While trying to wake the male driver, the officer observed a small yellow/green, glass smoking pipe lying in plain view on the floorboard. The officer detected an odor of marijuana inside the vehicle. The male woke up and related that he was tired so he stopped in the parking lot to rest and fell asleep. The officer asked him about the glass pipe and he became really nervous. The officer asked if there was any marijuana in the vehicle. The male sounded as if he was starting to cry and stated that he had some inside of his pocket. The officer removed the male from the vehicle and searched him. The officer discovered 3, tied up cellophane baggies containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, inside of the male's right front pocket. The officer placed the male in handcuffs and placed him in the back seat of the patrol vehicle. Another officer arrived to assist. While conducting an inventory of the vehicle, the officer discovered a 12' glass smoking "bong" that was located on the back seat, behind the driver's seat. Also found during the inventory was a small metal "grinder" that was in the center console. The vehicle was impounded and the driver was taken to jail. All evidence was submitted to CID.

**Offense: Narcotic Law Violation**

**Date: 06.04.16**

**Time: 0040 hours**

**Location: 15300 blk San Pedro**

An officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. After making contact with the male driver he identified himself with a State of Texas driver's license. A computer check showed that he had an active and extraditable Felony warrant for his arrest out of the State of Washington. The officer placed the male under arrest for the warrant. A loaded hand gun was found on the driver's side floorboard. While being placed under arrest, the driver was asked if there was anything illegal on his person and he voluntarily stated "there is a lot of stuff". A search of the male resulted in the location of a large wad of U.S. currency in his left front pocket. In the vehicle, officers found one Glock Pistol, large glass jars some of which contained a green leafy substance, a firearm and a wad of cellophane bags containing multiple suspected narcotics in the forms of a pinkish colored powder with pieces of crystallized material, white colored hard rock type material and (3) pills in the colors of blue, light blue and reddish. The driver was read his Miranda Rights and asked if he wished to answer any questions. He stated voluntarily that there was another hand gun in the trunk of the vehicle. The second hand gun was found in the trunk. The vehicle was impounded at the scene. The suspected narcotics were tested using the appropriate test kits and showed to be cocaine, methamphetamine and marihuana. All the evidence and cash were seized. The male was processed and booked into jail on the warrant and several felony charges.
