Offense: Theft

An officer was dispatched for a report of a vehicle theft. Upon arrival the officer made contact with the elderly male victim. The male reported he had arrived at the gym at approximately 5:00 pm and parked his car in the third row away from the building, facing the building. The male told the officer that while he was in the men's locker room he stepped away from his locker and when he returned he found that his car keys were missing. His wallet and cell phone were still in the locker. When he left the gym he found that his car was gone. The vehicle was entered into police computers as stolen.

A HCV officer overheard HPPD being dispatched to a call involving a male with a gun. The HPPD Sergeant said that he was following the suspect vehicle on Mecca Drive heading toward HCV. BCSO coded the call and the HCV officer traveled to the location utilizing emergency lights. Upon arrival to the 200 blk of Mecca Drive, the HCV officer found several Precinct #3 Constables out with seven people at gunpoint. The only individual still in the car was the female driver. The HCV officer opened her door and removed her seat belt and she passively resisted exiting the vehicle by pulling her arm backward as the officer attempted to pull her out of the car. The officer was finally able to extract her from the vehicle and she was placed on the ground and handcuffed. At one point the male suspect was attempting to kick out the window of one of the HPPD patrol cars. The HCV officer retrieved a pair of leg irons from his patrol vehicle and gave them to the HPPD officer. Officers applied the leg irons on the suspect. When they attempted to put him back in the vehicle he said that officers were going to have to put him

inside. The HCV officer grabbed the suspect by his arm and leg and began to force him into the backseat. An unknown officer on scene grabbed him through the other door and helped put him in the car. Once the doors were closed the suspect again kicked the door. Officers opened the door and pulled the suspect out of the backseat and he was placed in the prone position off the side of the road. The HCV officer then assisted by transporting a female prisoner to the Hollywood Park Police Department. The HCV officer then began a search of the 100 and 200 block of Mecca Drive to make sure that the suspects had not thrown a firearm out the car window. The search met with negative results.
