## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance**

**Date: 06.15.14**

**Time: 0037 hours**

**Location: 14300 blk San Pedro**

While on routine patrol an officer observed a vehicle driving around a closed business. The vehicle appeared to be a white compact automobile occupied by one individual. A traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle. The officer immediately noticed the male driver appeared to be extremely nervous. The officer could smell marijuana coming from the driver. The officer asked him about it and he told the officer he had just finish smoking at his friend's house and he may have some in his pocket. The officer asked the male if he had anything else in his possession. The male paused and hesitated to answer. The officer conducted a search of the male and found a white envelope concealing a plastic bag of what appeared to be methamphetamine. The officer tested the substance which showed to be positive for methamphetamine. The driver's vehicle was impounded and the driver was booked into jail.

### **Offense: Burglary of a Habitation**

**Time: 0815 hours**

**Location: 400 blk Tower Drive**

A resident called an officer for a burglary report. The resident reported that he believed an unknown person had broken into his back door, stolen a black/blue mountain bike and a wooden box with unknown contents. The resident told the officer he had purchased the residence and the previous owner had left all of his personal items inside the residence. A bedroom had been rummaged through. There were numerous valuable items throughout the house that were left

untouched. It appears the unknown suspect had been inside the property on a previous occasion and knew exactly where they were going. The bike had been inside the garage. There were several bikes in the garage, but only one bike was stolen. The officer photographed the crime scene. This case is under investigation.

**Offense: Driving While Intoxicated**

**Date: 06.19.14**

**Time: 0145 hours**

**Location: 400 blk Tower Drive**

A resident called in to report a suspicious vehicle on her property. A short distance from the residence, officers found a fence that appeared to have been crashed through. An officer had noticed a truck drive by with some front end damage. That officer went after the truck and a traffic stop was conducted. The driver was found to be intoxicated and was booked into jail. The first officer went to talk the caller that reported a suspicious vehicle. The caller reported she had seen a white truck drive onto the property. The truck had tried to squeeze between a tree and the caller's car which caused the truck to scrape the car. The truck that had crashed through the fence was the same truck described by the caller. The driver told the arresting officer that he did not remember crashing into anything despite having major damage to his truck.

**Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance/Possession of Marijuana**

**Date: 06.19.14**

**Time: 2117 hours**

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

While doing a business check, an officer observed a black GMC truck parked at a closed business. The vehicle's driver side door was open and the occupant's appeared to be having a quarrel. To ensure the safety of the subjects involved the officer initiated an investigation by activating his vehicle's emergency lights. After making contact with the occupants it became apparent that both were under the influence of an unknown substance. Both people were separated and the officer asked if there were any narcotics in the vehicle. Both subjects denied having any narcotics within their possession and gave consent to a vehicle search. While approaching the vehicle the officer observed a plastic bag containing more than a usable amount of marijuana within the opened driver's side door where the driver was sitting. Once the actual vehicle search began, a plastic bag containing a white powdery substance that resembled cocaine was located in the woman's makeup bag. It had been concealed within an envelope displaying her name and address. The narcotics were tested and came back positive. Both husband and wife were booked into jail on narcotics charges.
