Offense: Field Contact

Location: 13700 blk San Pedro

An officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop in the 15600 block of San Pedro due to the vehicle having its driver's side headlight not functioning. The officer activated his emergency lights in an effort to get the vehicle to stop. The operator of the vehicle did not come to a complete stop nor did they turn into any of the multiple parking lots while he was attempting to stop them. In the 13700 block of San Pedro, the operator of the vehicle stopped in the parking lot of a business. The officer approached the vehicle and found the operator to be an elderly female. The elderly female explained that she did not realize that he was trying to stop her and that she believed the officer was trying to get around her. The female continued to state that she was of the impression that moving to the far right lane and slowing down was the right thing to do given that she did not think the officer was trying to stop her. After conducting a computer check of the female, she was released without a citation and told about her headlight being out. The little old lady was only trying to do the right thing by getting out of the big, bad policeman's way.

An officer was conducting traffic enforcement in the 500 block of W. Bitters using stationary radar in a marked patrol car. The radar indicated that the approaching vehicle, the only vehicle visible on the roadway, was travelling at 55 mph in a 40 mph zone. The officer gave immediate

pursuit of the vehicle and followed while the driver turned right onto Walker Ranch road, then right onto Bluff Estates. At that time the officer activated the emergency lights and conducted the traffic stop for the speed violation. The driver then turned right again onto Bluff Ivy and stopped. The officer made contact with the male driver who stated that he did not have a driver's license as it was suspended, however; produced a State of Texas Identification Card identifying himself. A computer check was conducted and showed the driver to have 2 warrants. The officer called the City of San Antonio to verify the warrants and was told by the operator that they were valid and active. The driver's vehicle was impounded and he was booked into jail.

An officer received a call for an activated alarm at an auto parts store. The officer responded and upon arrival, immediately noted that the front glass doors had been pried open. The officer notified dispatch and entered the building to conduct a check. The officer was unable to locate any person(s) inside of the building. As the officer entered, he noted that a 12 oz., bottle of Max Life Fuel System Cleaner was lying next to the door. The officer also noted that a small box containing an oil filter and a package containing a single spark plug was lying on the floor of the first aisle near the customer service desk. No other items seemed to be in disarray. The officer contacted dispatch and requested a key holder respond. Dispatch was unable to reach a key holder. While processing the scene, the delivery truck arrived. The driver attempted to contact a manager that he had listed but was unsuccessful. The officer continued to process the scene and collect evidence. A second officer was later able to get in touch with the manager.
