An employee of a local restaurant telephoned the patrol cell phone to report a customer had their vehicle burglarized. Upon arrival to the location, a male flagged the officer down in the parking lot and related person(s) unknown had broken into his vehicle while he was inside eating. The male reported he had parked his vehicle (which had a boat and trailer attached) in the parking lot of the gym due to lack of space at the restaurant. The male said when he returned to his vehicle, he observed the passenger's side rear window to be shattered and the interior of his vehicle to be in disarray. At the time of the report, the male was only able to identify an IPAD and a camera to be missing. The male related once he returned home and was able to go through the vehicle, he would be able to determine what else may be missing. Upon closer inspection of the vehicle, it was observed the unknown actors had first attempted to pry open the passenger's side door

lock in an attempt to enter the vehicle. There were numerous items of value in the vehicle that were not disturbed. No items were indicated as being missing from the attached boat or trailer. At approximately 1651 hours on the same date, the male returned the property loss supplement with items identified as being taken without his consent.
