## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Burglary of a Building**

**Date: 07.08.12**

**Time: 1513 hours**

**Location: 15300 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched for a Burglary report. The officer arrived and contacted the female caller who reported that an unknown person threw a large rock at an office window. The officer asked the female if she had a phone number for the building manager. The female contacted the manager for the officer. While waiting for the manager, the officer checked the business and found all other perimeter windows and doors to be secure. The officer observed some evidence on the wooden trim along the window and collected the evidence. The officer also observed shoe prints near the bottom of the broken window. The manager arrived and made arrangements to secure the broken window. The business owner was notified and asked to come to the business. The business owner said she would be on the way and gave the officer consent to enter the office and process the scene. When the owner arrived and checked the office, she found that her main computer system and back up hard-drive had been stolen. The crime scene was photographed and evidence was collected.

### **Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle**

**Date: 07.11.12**

**Time: 1230 hours**

**Location: 15800 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to a vehicle burglary. Upon arrival, contact was made with the owner who related he was in the restaurant eating lunch. When he returned to his vehicle, he noticed the interior to be slightly messed up. The owner said he noticed the screen for his radio system to have been slid down and thought maybe his vehicle had been burglarized. The owner checked

his vehicle for any missing items and discovered a Tag Hauer watch that was placed in the driver's door pouch to be missing. He then discovered person(s) unknown had pried the driver's door lock mechanism to his vehicle, entering his vehicle and removing the items without his consent. After discovering the burglary, the owner proceeded to depart the location and return a co-worker to his office. The owner then returned to the establishment where he called and waited for police. The owner told police he did not notice any additional items missing at that time, but did agree to proceed with criminal charges if any suspect(s) could be identified. This case is under investigation.

**Offense: Criminal Trespass**

**Location: 200 blk Village Circle**

An officer was dispatched to a residence for a known male, trespassing on the property. Upon arrival, the officer observed the male standing in the driveway, just inside the front gate line. The officer detained the male and placed him in the back seat of the patrol car. The resident reported that the male had entered her property and knocked on the front door. When no one answered the door, the male departed the property. The resident also reported that shortly before the officer arrived on scene, the male had re-entered the property. The male is known to the police department as they have had several calls pertaining to the male. The male had been told in the past, to not trespass and this or any other residential property. The male was booked into jail.

**Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle**

**Time: 0955 hours**

**Location: 13800 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched for a Burglary of a Vehicle. Upon arrival, the officer contacted the business owner who reported their delivery truck had been broken into. The owner reported the truck had been parked at the business when they left on 7-11-2012. The truck was intact at that time. Upon returning on 07-12-2012, they discovered that an unknown suspect had entered the back door of the truck and stole several items. The owner said the truck's rear door had been locked with a pad lock but the lock was missing and there were no signs of forced entry. This case is under investigation.
