Offense: Wanted Person

Date: 07.11.16

Time: 0716 hours

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

An officer stopped a truck for traveling 63 MPH in a clearly posted 45 MPH zone. As the officer contacted the driver, he requested his license and proof of insurance. The driver stated he did not have a license. He also stated that he knew the truck was insured, but did not have the insurance card with him. The male driver provided his name and date of birth to the officer. A computer check showed the driver had six (6) active warrants for his arrest out of the San Antonio Municipal Court. The return did not show any valid ID or Texas license for him. The return also showed the insurance on the truck was unconfirmed and had expired on 06/06/2016. The warrants were confirmed and the driver was arrested. During the vehicle inventory, two credit cards were found that were not in the name of the driver. The credit cards were placed in the property room until the owner could claim them. The driver was booked into jail and the truck was impounded.

Offense: Violation of State Vehicle Laws

Location: 500 blk West Bitters Road

A male driver was stopped for speeding in the 500 block of West Bitters Road. He was traveling at 54 MPH in a clearly posted 40 MPH zone. As a result of the speeding violation, the officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The driver provided the officer with an expired driver's license and ID card. He also did not have a current insurance card, but stated there was coverage on the vehicle. A computer check confirmed current insurance coverage. The DL return showed

that it was Not Eligible and had an active suspension. As a result of the license suspension, the officer informed the driver that he would not be able to drive from the location. The driver stated he was feeling a little ill and in need of insulin. Due to the medical concern, the officer allowed him to call his boss to come to the location to pick up both the driver and vehicle. The driver was cited for three violations and released.

Offense: Evading Arrest

Date: 07.15.16

Time: 0421 hours

Location: Paso Del Norte @ San Pedro

An officer observed a vehicle (SUV) exiting the parking lot of a closed business which as seen its share of criminal activity. The vehicle slowed as if to allow the officer to pass. The officer flashed his lights, allowing the driver to exit so that the officer could get behind the vehicle with the intention of initiating a traffic stop. The driver exited the business and approached the stop sign on Paso Del Norte. The driver made a right turn onto the access road without coming to a stop and then accelerated to a high rate of speed. The officer activated the patrol vehicle emergency lights as the vehicle rolled past the stop sign at that intersection and began to follow the vehicle. The officer was unable to obtain a license plate or exact make of the vehicle. The officer pursued the vehicle southbound with the lights and siren activated. The officer contacted dispatch and informed them of the driver refusing to stop. The driver of the vehicle blackened out the vehicle lights and continued to drive southbound at a high rate of speed. The officer continued to pursue the vehicle as it exited US HWY 281 and moved onto San Pedro (Business). Due to the excessive speed of the vehicle, the officer discontinued the pursuit at San Pedro and Loop 410. The officer returned to the closed business and conducted a check of the area. The officer was unable to find any signs of a crime at the location. A gas compartment lid on a truck was open but no sign that any gas had been removed. The officer reviewed the in car video but was unable to obtain a license plate or exact make/model of the SUV. A message was left for HCVPD CID to contact the business and obtain any security video that may provide information pertinent to the case.
