An officer turned onto Brook Hollow and observed two vehicles that appeared to have been involved in a minor collision. The officer turned around in the TETCO parking lot in an attempt to pull behind the accident. As the officer was pulling up, the second vehicle, an Oldsmobile Alero, pulled around the first vehicle and sped off. The driver of the mustang began jumping up and down and signaling that the second vehicle was driving away. The officer activated his emergency lights to signal the Alero to stop. The vehicle continued on Brook Hollow and turned south on the 281N access road. The vehicle continued driving south with the officer driving behind it with lights and siren activated. The Alero sped up attempting to elude the officer. The vehicle passed Winding Way and all the business parking lots along the way. The vehicle emergency flashers were activated and the vehicle continued to speed up while entering the highway. Once on the highway, the vehicle accelerated driving in and out of traffic. The driver of the vehicle was also turning the emergency flashers off and on. The suspect vehicle exited 281N southbound at Nakoma. The vehicle ran the red light at this intersection while continuing

to drive south. The officer slowed down to safely proceed through the red light, but due to this action, the officer lost sight of the vehicle. The officer informed dispatch that the vehicle was out of sight and to cancel any other responding units. At no time did the Oldsmobile make an attempt to stop for the officer. The officer contacted the driver of the first vehicle and notified SAPD to take the accident report.
