Calls of Interest

Offense: Fire Call

Date: 07.16.12

Time: 1820 hours

Location: 500 blk Tomahawk Trail

Officers were dispatched to a structure fire with a male subject possibly trapped inside. Due to the nature of the call, officers drove with emergency lights and siren to the location. Upon arrival an officer made contact with the homeowner. He told officers that everybody was out of the house and they had had a fire on the kitchen stove. The resident put the fire out with a fire extinguisher. An officer entered the location to check and see if the fire was out and it appeared that it had been extinguished. SAFD arrived shortly thereafter and they were briefed on the situation. The scene was then turned over to SAFD. Officer resumed patrol.

Offense: Obscene Display/Distribution

Date: 07.18.12

Time: 1731 hours

Location: 14000 blk San Pedro

An officer was contacted by a church pastor in reference to an obscene picture that was shown to one of his church volunteers. The officer made contact with the female church volunteer, who stated the following: While attending church on 15 July 2012, she was seated in the auditorium speaking to a male individual, known only to her as "Rick". The female stated that "Rick" had been living at the Haven for Hope facility and had been brought to church, along with other homeless individuals, for fellowship and ministry. The female stated this was a program implemented in an attempt to help the homeless. The female further stated that while engaged with "Rick" in conversation about his family, "Rick" offered to show her some pictures of his

son from his cell phone. The female stated that "Rick" shielded the cell phone while he brought up the pictures, then handed her the cell phone and told her to scroll through about 5 pictures. The female further stated that after about 3 pictures, a picture of a penis appeared on the phone screen. The female said she got upset, offended and embarrassed. "Rick" replied "sorry, you went too far." "That was me in the picture; do you want to see another picture?" The female told the officer she believed his statement was an offer to see more of his obscene pictures and she immediately left the church. The female stated that the picture was a close up of a penis, no clothing was visible. The female described "Rick" as being about 5' 4" to 5' 5" tall, short brown hair (almost shaved appearance), he had a blemish ("hickey") on his neck, and a tribal type of tattoo on his right forearm. The tattoo was a broad (wide) arrow with the arrow point on both ends. The female described the cell phone as being a fairly new touch screen type of phone but did not know the brand. The female completed a witness statement and gave it to the officer. This case is under investigation.

Offense: Burglary of a Building

Time: 0945 hours

Location: 15800 blk San Pedro

Several "Burglary of a Building" offenses were committed during the night at a local storage business. Several units were broken into by either cutting the locks or completely destroying the locking mechanisms. Some of the items stolen were rims, a television, china, a suitcase, and miscellaneous household goods. Many of the units that were broken into did not have anything stolen. These cases are under investigation.

An officer observed a vehicle traveling in the 100 block of Tower Drive with significant damage to the windshield. The officer felt that the damage would interfere with the drivers view. The officer ran the license plate and it returned showing that the vehicle's insurance policy was cancelled. The officer stopped the vehicle in the 14700 block of San Pedro. Contact was made with the driver and she was informed of the reason for the traffic stop. The driver provided the officer with her driver's license and said she did not have current insurance on the vehicle. A computer check showed the driver had three active municipal warrants for her arrest. The officer contacted a City Marshal who came to the location and took custody of the female. The female was cited for Failure to Maintain Financial Responsibility. The officer resumed patrol.
