## **Calls of Interest**

### **Offense: Information**

**Date: 07.25.16**

**Time: 1515 hours**

**Location: 100 blk Pontiac Lane**

A resident called city hall to report malnourished horses. An officer went to where the horses were located and observed two horses. Both horses were eating hay and had access to shade. The officer made contact with homeowner and informed him of the complaint. The owner told the officer that the horses are provided with plenty of water in various locations of the property. The owner stated that the hay is distributed in small amounts throughout the property in order for the horses to move around and eat. The owner told the officer that one of the horses was a rescue and that it has been gaining weight and is making huge progress from the time he rescued the horse. The officer questioned the owner about the horses becoming loose at times and he said that once they get on the driveway, the horse's weight triggers the sensor of the gate and it opens. The owner was informed of the ordinance prohibiting loose animals.

### **Offense: Suspicious Vehicle**

Officers were dispatched to a local restaurant for a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot. According to the manager, a dark colored truck had circled the parking lot a few times and backed into a parking spot facing the front door to the restaurant. Officers responded to the location and contacted the driver of the truck. The driver stated he was at the location waiting for a waitress who worked at the restaurant. A computer check showed the male to be clear. Contact was made with the waitress and she told officers that no one was supposed to be picking her up at work. She knew of the male as a customer and had no intention of leaving with him. The male was informed and was asked to leave the parking lot of the closed business.

**Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance**

An officer observed a vehicle pass him, at what he believed to be a high rate of speed. The officer activated the radar and clocked the vehicle travelling over the clearly posted speed limit. The officer pursued the vehicle which came to a stop in the 15100 block of San Pedro. The officer made contact with the driver. The driver was unable to provide a TX driver's license. The driver provided his name and date of birth. A computer check of the information provided revealed that the driver had an outstanding Bexar County warrant for a probation violation. Contact was made with dispatch who confirmed the warrant as valid. The driver was taken into custody and searched. During the search, a small bottle of pills was discovered in his left shirt chest pocket. The pills were in an unmarked glass container and contained 54 small, blue tablets. The tablets had markings of "V" and "2531" on them. The tablets were identified as Clonazepam. The driver stated that he had a prescription at home but liked to carry them in the antique bottle. An inventory of the vehicle was conducted and two (2) small cellophane baggies, each containing a green leafy substance were discovered underneath the driver's seat. The driver stated that the suspected marijuana belonged to him. Each of the two baggies contained approximately 1 gram of suspected marijuana. The suspected marijuana was tested and showed to be positive. The vehicle was impounded and the driver was booked for drug possession and the warrants.

While on the above traffic stop, a computer check was done on the passenger. The passenger showed to have six municipal warrants. The passenger was booked on the warrants along with the driver of the vehicle.
