## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Assist the Public**

**Date: 07.30.13**

**Time: 2255 hours**

**Location: 14800 blk San Pedro**

Officers were dispatched to a local business for a homeless man going through a dumpster in the parking lot. Upon arrival, officers contacted the homeless man who stated he was trying to find some food and or something to drink. A computer check was done on the male and he was found to be clear. The male said he was trying to get to Seguin by bus, so an officer gave him a ride downtown to be closer to a shelter where he may have been able to find help. The officer resumed patrol.

**Location: 100 blk Tower Drive**

An officer was parked along the side of the roadway in the 100 block of Tower Drive. A vehicle pulled behind the patrol vehicle and the female driver stepped out and began to approach the officer. The officer exited the patrol vehicle and met with the female. At that time, a second vehicle pulled up and a female driver exited and immediately confronted the first female, aggressively questioning as to why she passed her vehicle. The officer moved female #2 back to her vehicle, obtained her driver's license and instructed her to wait until contact was made with her. The officer met with female #1 who said she had been traveling north on Tower Drive, behind female #2. Female #1 further stated that female #2 had slowed to a stop in the roadway as she approached a puddle of water. Female #1 stated that she did not know why female #2 was stopping but decided to move her vehicle around and continue on Tower Drive, which she stated she did safely. Female #1 continued stating that as she got to the area of Tower Drive and Limestone Creek, she noticed female #2 was traveling behind her. Female #1 stated that female

#2 followed her to all the way to her street and began yelling at female #1 as female #1 turned her vehicle around. Female #1 felt frightened and did not want to go to her residence, so she continued to drive toward City Hall while female #2 continued to follow. The officer met with female #2, who stated she was following female #1 after she passed her vehicle because she didn't know if she lived in the city and felt her driving was erratic. Female #2 was informed that her actions could be taken as aggressive and could lead to a volatile situation. Female #2 was further instructed that in the future, she should contact the police department to handle the situation. Both parties were allowed to depart separately without any further action being taken. The officer resumed patrol.

**Location: 15700 blk San Pedro**

The manager of a local gym called the city cell and requested officers to assist with removing an employee from the gym. The manager went on to say the employee had been observed stealing goods from the gym and was no longer allowed inside the gym. Officers arrived and contacted the employee in question, just outside the main entry door to the gym. An officer explained the situation to the employee. The employee said he wanted to talk to the gym's general manager who was already en route to the gym. The officer asked the employee to wait in his vehicle until she arrived. Once the general manager arrived, she contacted the employee at his vehicle. At that time, in the presence of officers, she informed the employee that he was no longer allowed inside the gym or on the gym property. The employee began to get angry and argue with the general manager at which time the officer told the employee to leave the property or he would be arrested for trespassing. The employee departed the location without further incident. No further action taken at that time and the officers resumed patrol.
