**Offense: Assist other Agency**

HCV officers were dispatched to assist SAPD with an arrested male that escaped from officers while wearing handcuffs. Computer notes indicated the male ran eastbound on Bitters Road toward a ditch. HCV officers staged in the area, but did not observe the male in the area. Updated information placed the male near 1604 and Blanco. HCV officers moved into Hollywood Park to try and intercept the escapee. It was later learned that the male was captured by SAPD. HCV officers resumed patrol.

The suspect wanted to be paid for the work he had done up until the time he walked off the job. The manager told the suspect he would be paid when the tool were returned. The suspect has yet to return the tools. This case is under investigation.

An officer was dispatched to an urgent Bexar County call because all Deputies in the area were tied up on other calls. The call was for a suicide. The HCV officer was the first officer on scene. The HCV officer stood by until the Bexar County Deputies arrived and took over the scene. The HCV officer resumed patrol.
