Calls of Interest

Offense: Unlawful Use of a Motor Vehicle

Date: 08.10.16

Time: 1327 hours

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

An officer was traveling southbound in the 13800 block of San Pedro in a marked patrol car. The patrol car is equipped with a License Plate Reader. The LPR hit on a white 2015 Honda Civic. The hit on the LPR showed a stolen vehicle hit. The officer pulled behind the car at the stop light of San Pedro and Bitters Road. The officer ran the plate through the police computer and the return confirmed the car was listed as stolen through SAPD. The officer requested back-up to initiate the traffic stop. Once the light turned green, the car turned left onto Bitters Road. The officer activated the emergency lights to signal the vehicle to stop. The car traveled east on Bitters Road until Heimer Road. At Heimer, the vehicle made a left turn onto Heimer and pulled into a parking lot at that corner. The officer contacted the female driver and requested the keys to the vehicle. The officer explained to the female why she had been stopped. The female seemed to be confused and said a friend had let her borrow her car. Back-up officers arrived on scene at that time. The officers secured all the occupants of the vehicle. While doing this, the officer spoke briefly to the driver and asked her again where she had gotten the vehicle. The female said a friend named Mari had come to pick her up earlier in the day. She could not recall any more information on Mari, the location where Mari picked her up, or where Mari had gotten the vehicle. The driver was secured in the back seat of the patrol car. The driver told the officer that she did not have an id with her. While checking the front passenger area, an officer found a syringe and small red case containing various forms of narcotics (see next blotter entry). The vehicle owner was called to the scene to get her car. Upon her arrival, she stated she had misplaced her spare set of keys on Sunday 08/07/16. She said she woke up this morning

around 0730 hours and noticed the car was missing. The owner stated she did not give anyone consent to borrow the car. The owner's neighbor claimed to have video footage of the suspects taking the car this morning, 08/10/16 at approximately 0149 hours. The driver and a backseat passenger were transported back to the police department so officers could complete reports.

Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance

Date: 08.10.16

Time: 1327 hours

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

An officer received a call from dispatch to cover a fellow officer who was following a possible stolen vehicle. The officer arrived and contacted a male at the front passenger door. The male was placed in handcuffs and put inside the patrol vehicle for safety and investigative purposes. The two females in the backseat were removed from the vehicle and handcuffed. An officer then conducted a search of the front passenger seat where the male was located and discovered seven clear small bags with a crystal like substance, three yellow pills in a clear plastic bag and numerous small empty plastic baggies commonly used for the sale of narcotics in a black bag that was located at the male's feet. The officer also discovered (a syringe with .23 CC's of a brown liquid substance) inside the glove box where the male was located. The male was checked for warrants and the return came back clear. The drugs were tested and found to test positive for heroin and methamphetamine. The male was booked on drug charges.

Offense: Failure to Identify-Fugitive

Location: 13800 blk San Pedro

An officer was investigating a stolen vehicle that was occupied by four individuals. The officer made contact with the back seat driver's side passenger and requested her id. She said she did not have an id with her. The officer asked her for her name and date of birth which she provided. The officer returned to the patrol car and conducted a computer check on the name provided. The return came back showing no record. The female had lied to the officer several times by giving false names. When she finally gave her correct name, she showed to have 1 active Bexar County warrant and 5 active municipal warrants. The female was booked on the warrants and Failure to Identify.

Offense: Prostitution

Date: 08.11.16

Time: 1650 hours

Location: 15700 blk San Pedro

The San Antonio Police Department Vice Unit received a complaint in reference to possible sex crimes occurring at a massage/spa located in Hill Country Village. A SAPD Vice Officer contacted the HCVPD to determine jurisdiction and inform HCVPD of the complaint. It was determined that the complaint received by SAPD matched a complaint received by HCVPD dated July 9th, 2016. The Vice Officer said he would assist HCVPD with conducting an

undercover operation at the location. The Vice Officer entered the location to determine if illicit sexual activity was occurring. He paid \$60.00 for a one hour massage and near the end of the massage, the masseuse made an offer of a sexual act for an additional \$40.00. When the signal was given, HCVPD officers entered the business and arrested the masseuse for prostitution. The business owner was cited for violating City Ordinance and the Certificate of Occupancy was pulled from the business. The masseuse was booked into jail.
