## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Possession of Marijuana**

**Date: 08.16.15**

**Time: 1600 hours**

**Location: 100 blk South Tower Drive**

An officer observed a vehicle traveling northbound at what appeared to be a high rate of speed. The officer initiated the radar in the patrol vehicle and obtained a high audible tone and observed the speed indicator on the radar showing the Camaro was traveling at 40 MPH, in a clearly posted 30 MPH speed zone. The officer activated the emergency lights on the patrol vehicle and turned the patrol vehicle to pursue the Camaro. The operator of the Camaro stopped in the 100 block of South Tower Drive. While the officer asked the driver for his license and insurance, the officer could smell marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The driver denied having any marijuana but the officer found marijuana in the vehicle. The driver was arrested and booked into jail.

An officer was near the intersection of Bitters Road and West Avenue when he saw a vehicle run a red light at a very high rate of speed. As the vehicle entered Hill Country Village, the officer tried to catch up to the vehicle. The officer was able to catch up to the vehicle at Tower Drive and Hill Country Lane. The driver of the vehicle was unable to get through the construction zone at this location. The driver was unsteady on his feet and had slurred speech. The driver did a field sobriety test and failed the test. The driver was arrested and booked for Driving While Intoxicated.

**Offense: Possession of a Controlled Substance**

**Location: 13600 blk San Pedro**

An officer observed a vehicle traveling at what appeared to be a high rate of speed. As the vehicle passed the officer and approached the intersection of South Tower Drive and Winding Way, the officer observed the vehicle fail to stop at the stop sign posted at the intersection and make a right hand turn. The officer was able to get the vehicle stopped in the 13600 block of San Pedro. Contact was made with the driver and sole occupant. The officer asked the driver why he was attempting to duck the officer and he said that he was worried about his mother's car being taken away. The driver appeared to be very nervous and his hands were shaking as he provided the officer with his driver's license and insurance. The officer asked the driver why he was so nervous and he stated again that he was worried about his mother's car because she had quite a bit of control over him. The officer asked the driver to exit the vehicle and once he was out the officer informed him that in his experience someone displaying his level of nervousness generally had something in the vehicle that they should not have. The driver told the officer that there was a small baggie of marijuana in his backpack. The officer told the driver that he should be honest. The driver told the officer that there was a syringe and a spoon in his backpack for cooking Heroin. A search of the backpack revealed a syringe with a small amount of liquid in it as well as a spoon with burn marks on the bottom. The officer asked the driver if he had any Heroin on him and he originally said no. The driver later admitted that there was a baggie of it in a pocket in his wallet. The driver was arrested for the heroin and an outstanding warrant.
