## **Calls of Interest**

**Offense: Disturbance**

**Date: 08.22.16**

**Time: 1632 hours**

**Location: 15600 blk San Pedro**

Officers were dispatched to a business parking for a physical altercation actively taking place. Officers responded with lights and sirens due to the nature of the call. Officers arrived and contacted the caller. The caller was an employee of one of the businesses. The caller pointed to a silver car parked behind his truck and said the two occupants had been fighting. An officer contacted the driver and had him exit the car. The officer conducted a pat down of the male to check for weapons. The female passenger was in the front seat crying. Both were questioned separately. The male said the female was his ex-girlfriend and he is the father of her unborn child. The male said they were driving down the access road when the female became upset about the lack of support she is receiving from the male. The male said she slapped his arm a few times with an open palm, but never "hit" him. The male also said he never "hit" her, but did raise his arm up to block a few of her slaps. The caller stated he saw the car turn into the parking lot and observed the couple slapping and hitting each other. The caller decided to block the exit of the parking lot and wait for the police. When the officer made contact with the female, she confirmed the ex's story. She said she was tired and admitted they had slapped each other on the arms. There were no visible injuries and neither party wanted to file charges. Both occupants agreed to keep their hands to themselves and they departed the location. Officers resumed patrol.

**Offense: Theft****Date: 08.25.16****Time: 0928 hours****Location: 400 blk Winding Way**

A resident came to City Hall to report a possible theft. The resident believed a former employee had stolen a gold necklace. The last day the resident saw her necklace was at 09:00am on May 16. On May 20 at 10:30am, she discovered the necklace was missing. The resident asked the employee about the necklace and the resident believed that due to the employee's body language and financial problems, she must have stolen the necklace. The employee was terminated on June 30<sup>th</sup> for poor job performance. This case is under investigation.

**Offense: Theft****Date: 083.26.16****Time: 1411 hours****Location: 13800 blk San Pedro**

An officer was dispatched to an auto parts store for a report of a theft that had just occurred at the location. Upon arrival contact was made with the store clerk who reported that on 08/25/2016 an unknown male opened the front door to the store, reached inside and took an unknown amount of motor oil from an end cap. On today's date, 08/26/2016, at approximately 1:21 P.M., the same male entered the location and approached the front counter asking for a paper towel to clean a large abscess that was bleeding on his forearm. While in the location the male asked a question about a part for a 2007 Saturn. While the clerk was looking up the information, the unknown male exited the store and grabbed three jugs of motor oil. The male was seen running along the building and getting into a green Saturn that was backed into a parking space in front of the adjacent store. The clerk was able to get a license plate number. The officer ran the plate and recognized it as a car he had recently stopped. Video footage confirmed it was the same male and vehicle that he had stopped. This case is under investigation.

**Offense: Terroristic Threats/Violation of a Protective Order/Evading Arrest****Date: 08.27.16****Time: 0405 hours****Location: 200 blk West Bitters Road**

An officer received a call in reference to a Burglary in Progress. It was later determined to be a disturbance call involving Terroristic Threats. The dispatcher related there was screaming going on in the background and that both parties had weapons. The officer responded with emergency lights. A HPPD officer was dispatched as cover. Several BCSO Deputies and SAPD units were also dispatched as cover. Upon arrival at the residence, the officer observed 2 females and 1 male crossing the roadway, coming from the house. The officer observed one female run southbound through a parking lot. The female was running at full speed and would look back at the patrol unit and emergency flashing lights several times. While the officer was pursuing the female, he hit the audible siren to further identify himself as a responding police unit. The female looked and continued to run. The officer had to pull his patrol vehicle in front of her path of travel while giving her commands to stop and get down on the ground. The female stopped,

got down on the ground and the officer placed her in handcuffs and sat her in the back seat of the patrol unit. The officer returned with the female to the incident location and made contact with the resident. The resident reported that he saw a male at the back door of his residence. The male was yelling and banging on the glass door and windows with his closed fist and screaming to get his son back from his ex-wife. The female that ran from police was yelling and also making threats to harm both the resident and the ex-wife. According to the resident, the male was making threats to harm and/or kill them if they did not return their child to him. The resident reported the male had a semi-automatic hand gun in his hand at the time. No gun was found on the male or at the scene. The male was booked for Violation of a Protective Order and Terroristic Threats. The female was booked for Evading Arrest.
