Offense: Burglary of a Vehicle

An officer was flagged down by a male in a business parking lot. The male told the officer his company vehicle had been broken into by an unknown person(s) and property was taken without his consent. The male reported he had arrived at the location to eat lunch with some co-workers at a local restaurant. The male said he parked the vehicle in an adjacent parking lot because of overcrowding. When he returned to his vehicle, he observed the driver's door window to be shattered and broken out. Upon closer inspection of the vehicle, he observed person(s) unknown had attempted to pry the locking mechanism open on the driver's door as well. The only items he noticed missing was a laptop bag containing a laptop computer from the front passenger side floorboard and another bag containing papers, which was of no value. The male said he had already contacted his company's IT department regarding the computer and was informed the stolen laptop did possess a tracking system. The male was provided a case number. The officer requested the male's identification which the male provided. A computer check revealed his license had a suspension and he was currently awaiting a hearing for several recent vehicle burglaries. The officer asked the male why he appeared to be so nervous. The male stated he had recently been smoking an illegal drug. A second officer arrived on scene and conducted a check of the car lot. All appeared to be in order. The male was told that due to his admission of recently using drugs and his license return showing a suspension, he should find an alternate ride home. The male agreed to contact a tow-truck to transport him and his vehicle off the property. The officer waited with the male until the tow-truck arrived. Upon their departure, the officer resumed patrol.
